

The cadets will revert to civilian status at the school and will not receive army reserve commissions upon graduation.

The senior officers and more than 100 non-commissioned of ficers marched in formation at midnight Tuesday to the home of President Gibb Gilchrist. Awakened by the chants of cadets and the "fight" song played by the corps band, President Gilchrist appeared briefly on the porch of his home. He listened to the protests of the cadets and then accepted the resignations of the senior

Later the resigned officers demanded the resignation of Gilchrist as president of the college. They said his attitude toward them at a conference had been "insulting."
