Such days as are too hot, or too cold, or too windy for outdoor work, and some of each night should be spent reading in the home.





NEW ROAD IS CHARTERED

Altus, Lubbock, Roswsll and El Paso R. R. To Have Capital of \$500,000.00

News Special.

Austin, Texas, May 34. - The Secretary of State today granted a charter to the Altus, Lubbock, Roswell & El Paso Railroad Company of Texas, with capital stock of \$500,000 and headquarters at Lubbocn. The articles of incorporation were approved by Assistant Attorney General William E. Hawkins.

The incorporators of the road are Edward Kennedy, W. V. Kennedy, F. E. Wheelock, H. E. Chapman, J. J. Dillard, R. J. Dillard of Lubbock; Homer Howard, Lockney; Fred Biffle, M. P. Stone, Silverton; O. L. Slaton, Lubbock.

The places from and to which it is intended to construct the proposed railroad and the intermediate countiea follow:

Commencing at a point in Collingsworth County, six miles due west to Hollis, and running thence in a southwesterly direction through Collingsworth, Don ley, Hall, Briscoe, Floyd, Hale, Lubbock, Hockley and Cochran counties to a point on Cochran County on the line between the State of Texas and Territory of New Mexico.

EXPERIMENTAL STATIONS.

College Station Texas, May 20, 1909. - The following statement has been given out by H. H. Harrington, Director of Texas Experiment Stations:

"The recent law passed by the 31st Legislature establishing additional experiment stations, provides that two of these stations shall be established west of the 98 meridian, of which shall be in West Texas, and one in northwest Texas; one shall be located In what is known as the Black Land Belt, in central or north Texast and one shall be in the Rice Belt of south or southeast Texas, and at such other point as said Board shall designate.

"An approgriation of \$25,000 annually is made for the maintenance and support of such stations as shall be established by a board consisting of the Govenor, the Lieutenant Governor and Commissioner of Agriculture. 


