There are several reasons for the attorney general that a woman had to pay both city and county poll tax in order to vote in State and County primaries. The women, or some of them at least, argued since they were not permitted under the law to vote in eity elections they could see no necessity in paying a city poll. 

Hog Cholera

That farmers need no longer guess as to the practical methods now employed by State and National agencies to eradicate hog cholera, the following notes are given in the form of ques-

Q. Can hog cholera be prevented? A. Yes, by vaccinating the hog with cholera virus at the same time injecting a doseage of anti-cholera serum sufficient to counteract the effects of the live virus. In this way a mild case of cholera is induced after which

Q. Is there any danger of loing a hog in this vaccinating process? A. Very little if the hogs are not and, infected at the time the work is done, and if they are in thrifty condition. In such conditions the danger of losing a hog is less than half of one per cases, however, the hogs have been exposed to cholera, are not thrifty, are sickly, or are undergoing the rigors of a long railway journey, the the losses from vaccination will


