

# Fighting On More Than One Front Is Good Strategy 

War isn't the only activity in which you usually have to fight on more than one front.

S. supplies to the Near East, whence they can be transshipped to Russia, the Suez area or North Africa.

There's a lesson in this, it seems to us, for the farmer. He wants to plan his work so he's through on one front before he has to shift to another; or so each front he opens will be a help.
