"But, of course, we cannot begin moving the passengers until the entente powers have ratified the peace treaty, when probably we shall char ter several big liners from America, declared Herr Vogelsang.

The United States, in the opinion of Geheimrat Jung, will receive but an infinitesimal proportion of Ger-many's army of emigrants. The German government at least is not encouraging emigration to the United States.


