The daylight-saving law's "stinger will be pulled out next Sunday morning. At 2 o'clock Sunday morning the hands of clocks and watches will be turned back to 1 o'clock and the Big Ben that has been so unmercifully and ferociousiy jangling at 7 a. m. present time will hold aloof ur to strike terror to the heart

Most of the people in West Texas have never been in favor of the daylight-saving law. It might have worked properly and effected a whole lot of good in the north and east, but in the south it was a different

The law was passed by congress before the war to enable a gain of daylight for work-ers and to stimulate production, giv-ing the laborer an opportunity in the late afternoon to plant and maintain a war garden.
