# FIVE COMPLETED WELLS FOTAL 2,350 BARRELS BOYD NO. 3 IS DUE SOON

Markham and Tidal Oil company's Copeland No. 21 is making 500 barrels from the lime from 3,370 to 3,380 feet. The well will be regarded as a temporary completion at that figure and further operations will wait on a decline in production. No. 19 is swedging casing after a shot. It was thought to be bridged, but it was found that the casing had collapsed. Texas Pacific Coal & Oil company's Butler No. 11 is pro-

ducing 500 barrels, with twenty feet of sand, from 3,430 to 3,450 feet. No. 9 is expected soon, and is drilling black lime at 3,432 feet. Sinclair Gulf's W. T. Davis No. 2 is now at 900 barrels, only three feet in the lime and drilling is held up. Top of the black lime was 3,303 feet. Satterfield No. 1 will get a shot today,

Self-Cleansing Bridgework Oral Hygiene Prophylaxis

Self-cleansing Bridgework is one of the chief advancements in the dental art which has been recorded in the past fifty years. There is a type of natural teeth which appear to be self-cleansing. Then again, other natural teeth are very hard to keep clean; in fact, impossible to keep clean unless a dentist is employed.

Almost ay bridgework is easier to keep cleap than some natural teeth, because some natural teeth are very hard to keep clean, while if bridgework is properly made its three surfaces are easily reached with the tooth brush and cleansing agent.

Bridgework for the Lower Jaw is made self-cleansing by having the bridge made of solid gold; the cusps on top of the bridge are made to articulate with the upper teeth and are easily cleansed. The under surface of a lower bridge should be V shape, so that the tooth brush will cleanse all surfaces. In fact, if a bridge is made this way, a person cannot brush his teeth without cleansing the bridge.

The upper bridge is as easily cleaned, but it requires just a little more time and pains. The outer surface of upper bridge teeth is usually porcelain (white) and is easily cleansed. The under surface is gold, and slants from the upper inner side of the white facing downward and inward, and connects with the grinding or occlusal surface. The tooth brush is easily made to cleanse it. The one feature about bridge teeth is that there are no inter-proximal spaces between them for food lodgement, and as cavities cannot form in bridge teeth as they do in natural teeth, it is admitted that a well-kept bridge is cleaner than the average natural

### Oral Hygiene and Prophylaxis (Clean Mouth)

A clean mouth includes a clean set of teeth, for if the teeth are not clean, the mouth is not-and surely there is no question but that a clean, well-kept set of teeth is one of the most valuable possessions a person

In fact, there is a large profit in a person keeping his teeth clean, because his dental bills will be about one-half if the teeth are well cared for. It is quite amusing to hear about our soldiers and sailors needing tooth paste when a tooth brush dipped in a little steeped tea, and then into a little table salt, makes one of the finest tooth cleansers in the world. At the same time it will toughen the gums if a person will give the gums a massage with the thumb or finger, always rubbing up toward the tooth on the lower gum and down toward the tooth on the upper gum, as this will give the gum tissues exercise and also aid the circulation.

ORAL HYGIENE is defined as the science of keeping a healthy mouth, and in order to do this one ought to consult a dentist every six months.

PROPHYLAXIS means the prevention of disease and dental prophylaxis would mean giving the teeth and gums such care and attention as would keep them in a state of health. This can only be done by daily care, and cleansing and frequent calls on your dentist.
