



International News Service.

CLEVELAND, Oh'o, Oct. 27 .- Apartment houses are branded as "race suicine" centers in a decision just handed down by Judge Martin Foran. "The folding bed," the judge declared, "is the skeleton which every apartment dweller has in his closet. When we see a woman exercising a pet poodle dog, clothed in soft wool raiment and attached to a silken cord, we know an apartment is nigh. But we see no sm'ling children gamboling about the doors."

The judge's opinion accompanied a decision upholding the police power of a municipality to prohibit the erection of apartments and enforce building restrictions.

"Construction of apartments," he declared, "will not solve the housing problem so long as the rapacity of avaricious landlords is permitted by law. The reflection that these devouring profiteers, in sowing the winds of selfishness, may reap a whirlwind of justice affords no consolation to the outraged tenant who finds his rent increased 100

"Many Cleveland apartments are in control of such profiteers, whose pernicious activities keep pace with their conscienceless cupidity. They laugh with fiendish glee at building codes, attack building restric-

tions, corrupt politics and fatten upon the necessities of the poor. "In the daytime the door of the closet is closed," said the judge, referring to the folding-bed apartments, "the skeleton is not in ev" dence, nor is any opportunity given to air it before people sleep in it again. It remains hidden during the day, and at night, it clutches in its bony embrace the victim, who sleeps in the carbon dioxide-infected
