## Government Not to Vacate Injunction TEXAS ARKANSAS NO.

### STRIKE DECLARED LAW \ ICLATION; TO BE LONG FIGHT

By Associated Press.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5 .- The government cannot accept the proposal of organized labor to e ic coal strike by va-cating the injunction against the officers of the United Mine Workers of America, Assistant Attorney General Ames in the absence of Attorney General Palmer announced today. The rez son given was that the strike was a violation of the law.

The statement of Ames follows: "The strike is a violation of the law and as long as it continues we are going to proceed in the courts. The dispute between the mine owners and workers is an entirely different question; they can settle it in

"The government cannot telerate the continued violation of the law such as this strike constitutes."

The government's refusal means a long fight in the coal fields while its withdrawal of the injunction would have med the way for settlement within forty-eight hours, according to Edgar Wallace, legislative representative of the United Mine Workers of America.




