The bullet passed through the vic-tim's kidney, liver and intes-

Pollard was rushed to the Ranger General Hospital in a Jone Cox ambulance and physi-

A thorough search of his room was made in a fruitless effort to find a pistol He denies having brought a gun with him from Mineral Wells. An eye witness to the affair identified Gordon as the man

who fired the shot.

Gorden is a restaurant worker by trade. He came here from burkburnett, where he worked in a cafe several months, accord-ing to the statement of a man who knows him.
