PITTSBURGH, Pa., Nov. 14 .- The automobile was declared to be "a greater menace to morality today than 'red-light' districts were thirty years ago," by Dr. B. S. Steadwell of La Cross, Wis., in a report of the World Commission on Social Purity at the World's Christian Citizenship Conference here today.

"Motor cars", said the speaker, "bring the country roadaouse practically to the city limits. This was the difficulty with the anti-vice zones surrouncing for military camps. They were not large enough. The perfection of transportation facilities popularized the distant resort twenty, that'y and even fifty miles away. and even fifty miles away.

*Today we appear to be getting what we have been asking for, a single trandard of morals. But the trouble with this single standard is that it is a low standard. The liber-tine has never been denied our best society, or the freedom of our best homes. Today the cigarette-smoking woman is not denied our best society if no open scandal has resulted from her exploits. The single standard that we desire is one that will place men upon as high a moral plane as we formerly demanded for women."

Dr. Steadwell praised the work which was being done in Australia, Canada, the United States, England, South America and South Africa for the promotion of purity and the suppression of commercialized vice. He said that the international movement for stamping out the "white slave" traffic, which virtually stopped during the war, had been resumed under the leadership of William Alexander Coote of England and that all of the com-




