while beating eggs.

Beat egg white until stiff. Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon colored. Add tapioca mixture to egg yolks and mix well. Fold into

colored Add tapioca mixture to egg yolks and mix well. Fold into egg whites.

Turn into hot buttered 10-inch skillet. Cook over low heat 3 minutes. Then bake in moderate oven (350°F.) 15 minutes. Omelet is sufficiently cooked when a knife inserted comes out clean. Cut across at right angles to handle of pan, being careful not to cut all the way through. Fold carefully from handle to opposite side and turn out on hot platter. Place Spanish Sauce between folded layers and around omelet. Serve at once. Makes 4 servings.

*Spanish Sauce. Melt 6 tablespoons butter or other fat in sauc." Add 1/4 cup each chopped onion and chopped green pepper and saute until onions are golden brown. Add 1 teaspoon salt, 2 teaspoons sugar, dash of cayenne, 1 cup canned sliced mushrooms and 2 cups canned tomatoes. Cook over low heat 15 minutes, or until vegetables are tender.

Soften yeast in water. Scald milk. Add sugar, salt and shortening. Coll to lukewarm. Add I cup flour. Mix well. Add softened yeast, erg and lemon rind. Mix well. Add enough more flour to make a soft dough. Turn out on lightly floured board or pastry cloth and knead until smooth and satiny. Place in greased bowl. Cover and let rise until doubled. When light punch down. Pinch off portions of dough and roll under hand until about 15 inches long and slightly less than be inch thick. Starting at center, wind each strip of dough locael a round and round. Let rise until doubled. Bake in moderate oven (3:75°F.) 20 to 25 minutes. If desired, frost with confectioners' sugar icing.






