Waxahachie Woman, President of 2nd Dist., TFWC, Is Candidate For 1st Vice President, TFWC

Mrs. William Robert Elliott of Waxahachie, president of Second District, TFWC, has been presented by the Waxahachie Century Club as a candidate for first vice president of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs. Her candidacy has been endorsed by her district in a letter to clubs signed by the first vice president and the secretary of Second district which she now is serving as president.

Excerpts from the letter, signed by the presidents of Waxahachie Century Club, Waxahachie Shakespeare Club, Waxahachie City Federation of Women's Clubs and Ellis County Federation of Women's Clubs, sent to clubs throughout the state, follow:

"Mrs. Elliott is a graduate of Trinity University, San Antonio, and received her M.A. degree with a major in speech arts and a minor in English from the University of Southern California at

Los Angeles. "Prior to her marriage, Mrs. Elliott was a teacher in the Texas public schools for ten years and was also an instructor in the speech department of Trinity University in 1935-36. She has traveled extensively in the United States, Mexico, Canada and Europe.

"With such a splendid background of formal education in numerous offices and as chairman of various important committees and in the following capacities: president of Waxahachie Century Club, Waxahachie Garden Club, Ellis County Branch of American Association of University Women, and the Women's Society of Christian Service of The First Methodist Church; first vice president of Delta Kappa Gamma (Alpha Alpha chapter) and of Heirloom Club, and social sponsor, eta Omega chapter of Beta Sigma Phi.

"Mrs. Elliott is the one person to whom our community is indebted for having organized a local Town Hall and assisted in the organization of The Ellis County Diner Club. She is always ready to lend a helping hand in civic affairs and is called upon continually to serve in many capacities in the community.

"She has served as chairman of the residential District Fund Drive for the American Red Cross, Blood Bank, March of Dimes and Poll Tax and the City Clean-Up Campaign.

"In 1952 Mrs. Elliott was elected "First Lady of Waxahachie." She also finds time to be an active member of the Rebecca Boyce chapters of Daughters of

the American Revolution, the Heirloom Club, Public Affairs Luncheon Club of Dallas, National Council of Flower Show Judges Club of Dallas and is a life member of Delta Kappa Gamma.

"As a member of the First Methodist Church, Mrs. Elliott takes an active part in various religious activities. She has taught in the Church School, assisted in Vacation Bible Schools, and has served as president of her circle of WSCS and also president of Women's Society of Christian Service, chairman of Christian Social Relations and Local Church Activities, and on program committee and committee on finance of the WSCS.

"She served as a member of the Board of Education, ex officio steward for membership on the Official Board and the Quarterly Conference, member of the Adult Division Council of the local church school, Pulpit Committee, and Building Committee of 'New Edifice' of The First Methodist Church.

"In addition to these local activities, Mrs. Elliott has been on the board as chairman of Pageantry and Drama in Second District, TFWC from 1946-1951; second vice president of Second District, TFWC 1951-53; and president of Second District, TFWC 1953-56.

"Since she has been president of Second District, she has attended two General Federation conventions — in Washington, D.C. in 1953 and Denver, Col. in 1954. She has served also as treasurer of District II, Texas

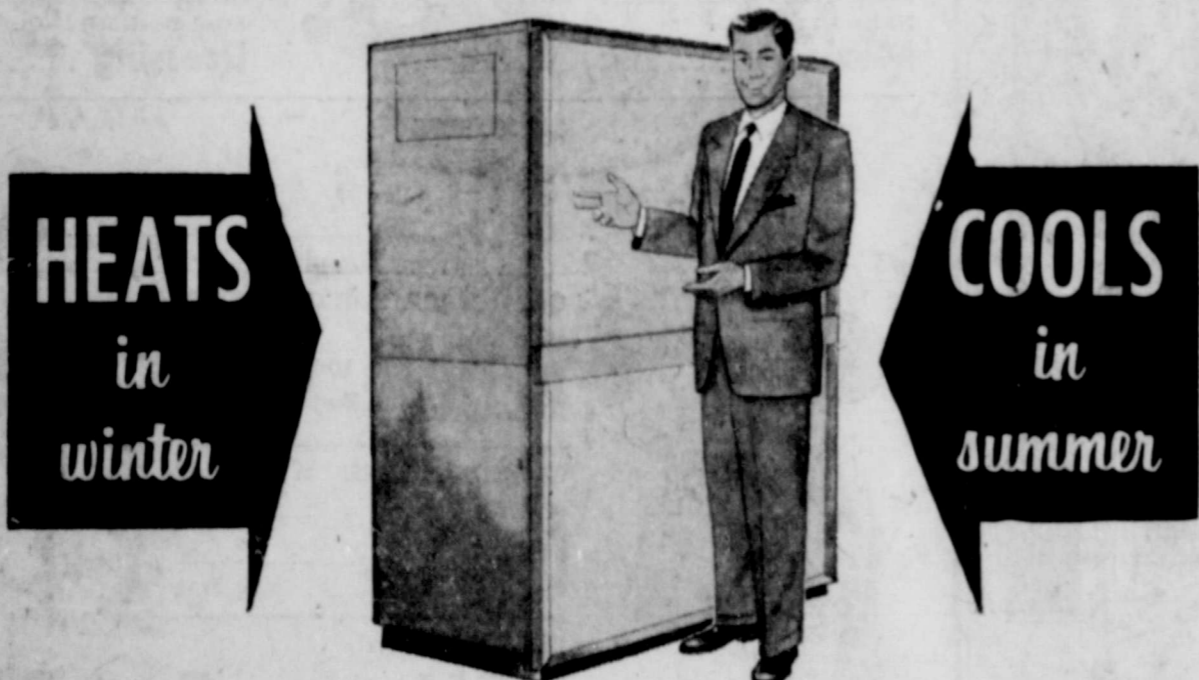

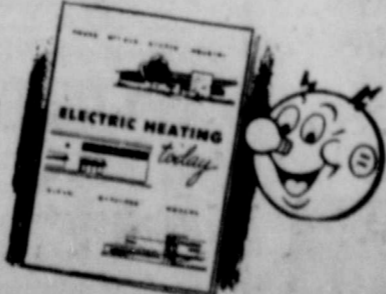

Mrs. John Gerhardt, pioneer Cisco area resident, died Monday at a Cisco hospital after a short illness. She was 85.

Funeral will be held at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Grace Lutheran Church there with the Rev. John G. Elser, pastor, officiating. Burial will be in the Lutheran Cemetery in the Romney community with the Hamner Funeral Home in charge.

Mrs. Gerhardt was born Dec. 2, 1870, in Germany and came to the Cisco area from Illinois. She was married in 1893 to John Gerhardt in Illinois. He died in September, 1952.

Surviving are one son, John Gerhardt of Cisco; four daughters, Mrs. Fred W. Stroebbe and Mrs. Marie Ericke, both of Cisco, Mrs. O. L. Brown of Maclin and Mrs. C. O. Weiser of Gladewater; 16 grandchildren and 12 great-grandchildren.

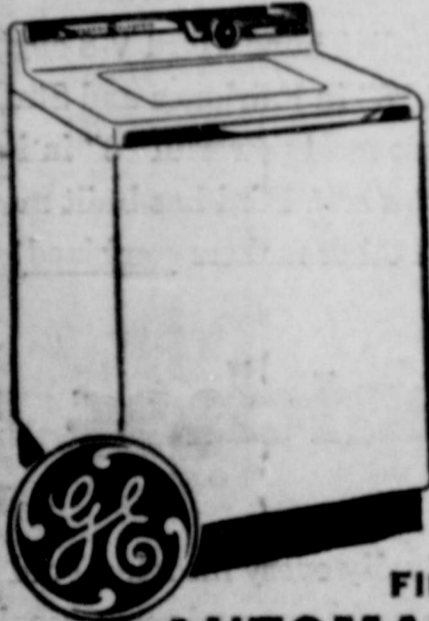
