(Continued From Page One)

ally incorporated into soil, or clipped, mowed, or cut to prevent maturing by not later than July without reimbursement under the agreement, control the spread on the acreage reserve of noxious weeds.

No person shall be eligible for compensation under the acreage reserve program with respect to any farm on which (1) the 1956 acreage of cotton exceeds the allotment for the commodity, or (2) the 1956 acreage of wheat exceeds the larger of the allotment for wheat or permitted acres; or (3) the 1956 acreage of the allotment for peanuts or one acre. No acreage should be plowed under, etc. in anticipation of participating in this program until a Soil Bank Acreage Reserve Agreement has been completed and filed with the county committee.

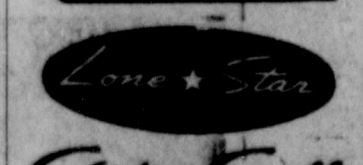

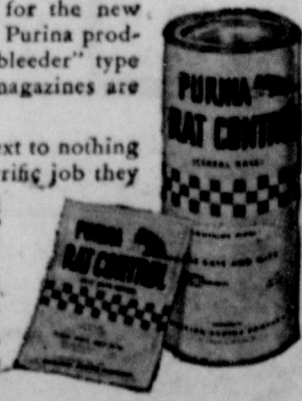

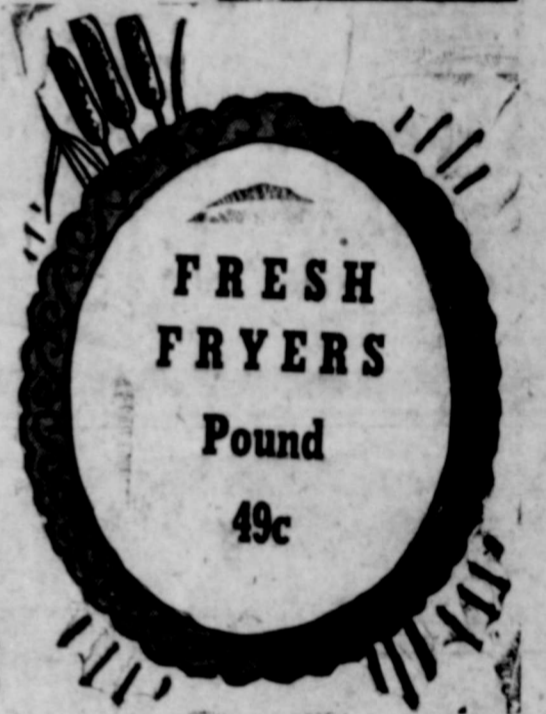
