There is nothing to keep him from accepting Daniel's resignation on that date, and appointing his own man to fill out the unexpired two-year term.

As it stands now, there are 49 Democrats, counting Daniel, and 47 Republicans. Counting Daniel out for a moment, that would leave 48 Democrats and 47 Republicans. If Shivers appointed a Republican, the count would be exactly even, 48-48. Richard Nixon, having the tiebreaking vote, could swing the organization of the Senate to the Republicans, which would carry with it all of the important committee chairmanships now held by the Democrats.


