

#### TEN DOLLARS A DAY

The News expressed the fear in advance that the special session of the Legislature would be of slight value to the State. The opening performance of that body gives no reassurance in this connection. The Senate gestures at working for nothing while the House refuses to work for less than \$10 per day, the quality of the Senate gestures being best judged from the fact that the resoultion proposed to give absent Senators \$1 a day. while those present were to get nothing. It might be a good investment to pay legislators a dollar a day to stay away from Austin when there is real work Who knows? to be done.

Investigating the Highway Department looked like "a good thing", and possibly is. But investigating the Democratic primary is guaranteed to furnish a full thirty days of excitement. Saving the State money is of moderate concern, but politics is so vastly more important that the legislators wouldn't be human if they resisted the impulse to waste as much time and money as possible while fighting the primary all over a-

that makes the governorship look like a poor man's job. In fact, as compared with some Dallas County officials, the Governor of Texas might be listed as among the unemployed. In saying this we make no insinuation that the Dallas County office-holders enjoy any illegitimate gains. The fees and perquisities are legal and moral, in the main, and some of the excesses revealed by the recent drastic audit had precedent for their guide. Carelessness, or lack of vigilance, accounted for some of the Dallas losses, whereas outright defalcation seems evident in only a few minor instances. The audit cost almost \$150,000, which is perhaps ten times as much as the county will recover. Yet it was worth the money. It disclosed laxity, slothfulness. indifference mounting to indolence, and will

serve to make subsequent beneficiaries of public office more energetic and circumspect. In truth the Dallas County audit was a service to the whole State, for what had been going on here has undoubtedly been going on in numerous other counties. A closer check-up will be had in all the counties hereafter, at least for a while. At last the whole people are aware that heavy taxation derives in part from bad courthouse management. A county manager, equivalent to the city managers now more or less common, may be the final outcome. Bad business at the courthouse no less than at the city hall means
