Another pioneer was Mrs. Vincen Heller, who was the first to begin a private school here, way back in 1881.

THE FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH was organized here in 1882 with 12 charter members, including Mrs. Mattie Gullatt Pitcock, Mr. and Mrs. George Whittington, Mr. and Mrs. Ab Gullatt, Mrs. Zillie Allison, Mrs. Bell Dobison, Dr. and Mrs. Westlake, and Mr. and Mrs. John Sanders.






