Fabulous fruits for Summer salads—luscious melons, rosy raspberries and blue, blue, blueberries; serve them often with a dash of fresh lime juice and these wonderful flaked coconut dressings. Make a "picture" of each salad plate—with crisp cross or other greens and a sprig of mint.

- Coconut Fruit Salad Dressing**
1/2 cup mayonnaise 1 teaspoon lemon juice
1/4 cup cream, whipped 1 tablespoon orange juice
1/4 teaspoon grated lemon rind 1/2 cup tender-thin flaked coconut, toasted
Fold mayonnaise into whipped cream. Blend in grated rind and fruit juice. Chill until ready to serve. Fold coconut into dressing just before serving. Serve on fruit salad with extra coconut sprinkled on top. Makes about 1 cup.
- Coconut Whipped Cream Dressing**
2 teaspoons orange juice 1/4 cup tender-thin flaked coconut
2 teaspoons sugar 1/2 cup cream, whipped
Dash of salt
Fold orange juice, sugar, salt, and coconut into whipped cream. Serve at once on fruit salad with extra coconut sprinkled on top. Makes about 1 cup dressing.

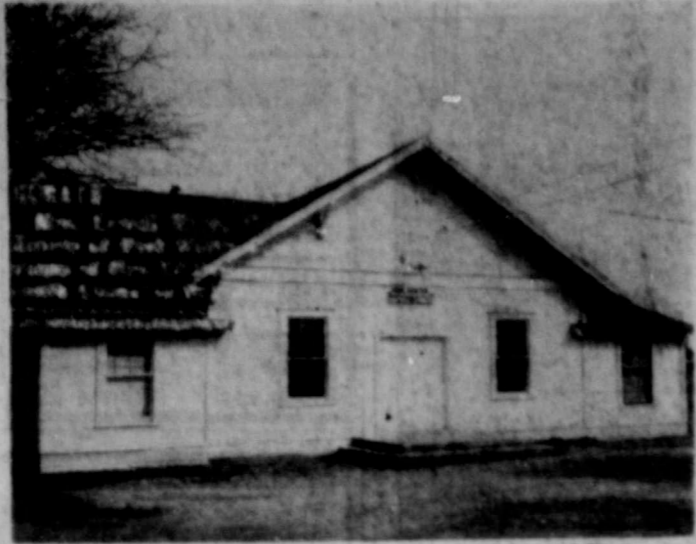
