Planting Winter Cover Crops? (EDITOR'S NOTE-The fore-

ceeding the setting of seed. This pretty well answers the question of when is the best time to plow a winter legume down. That is, it answers the question from the standpoint of maximum tonnage. There are other factors that maximake it advisable to settle for less than the maximum.

date. Right now, the main thing is to figure a way to dispose of that winter legume in such a way that another crop can be planted and cultivated, and also to increase the production.

Hairy vetch and Austrian Winter Peas offer little difficulty because of the brittleness of the vines when dry and the lack of toughness when wet. Clovers and alfalfa present difficulties because of tough stems and roots. The studies made last year indicate that the best way to handle any of these crops at first is the tandem disk. The heavier offset kind will do the job in one time over, where the lighter ones may require two or even three operations. In addition to this a stalk cutter is a benefit on the clovers after the stems and roots have had a chance to dry. The planting operation can usually be done within 10 days to two weeks, and even sooner if the feed crop to follow is drilled in. One farmer near Summerfield had a drilled milo crop up so that the whole field looked green just 18 days after disking in a 10 ton green weight, or 6400 pounds dry weight vetch crop. Listing has not been very successful on clover or alfalfa land because of the difficulty of cultivating before the roots and stems decay.
