The civilized world was plunged into mourning today. Thursday, when annotherment was made of the death of President Roosevelt. The President died at Warm Springs, Georgia at 3:15 P. M., Eastern War Time, of a cerebral hemmorage, suffered while he was having his portrait painted during a brief rest period from his war-time duties as president. Probably the loss of no other man would have been felt so keenly by the peoples of all nations throughout the world as that of our President. 


