Democratic Meeting Called For Wed. Night

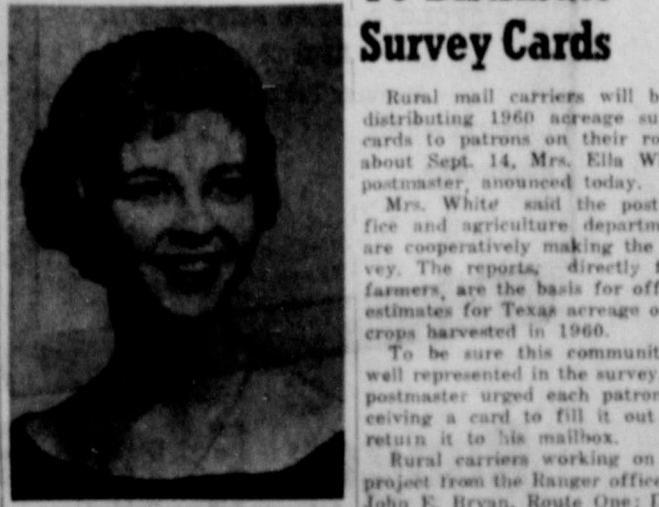
