pay off a bet that he made with you?

Jim was the town's most loyal supporter of the Marysville baseball team, even though the team was having a disappointing season. Tom, a supporter of Johnstown, a rival team, offered to bet Jim a sizable sum of money that Johnstown would beat Marysville. Jim was quick to accept and asked several bystanders if they would be witnesses to the bet.

That weekend Marysville won, but Tom refused to pay. Jim claimed that the bet amounted to a valid and binding contract. He wanted to bring a lawsuit against Tom to collect the money that he felt Tom legally owed him. However, he was advised that he did not have a case.

The bet that they made was a gambling contract, and as such was illegal. Where both parties assert rights founded on a contract which is illegal and void, the court will refuse to enforce it, leaving the parties just where they placed themselves, and as they were before coming into court. The court has said that they owe it to public justice, and to their own integrity to refuse to enforce contracts essentially violating morality or public policy. It is a judicial duty always to turn a claimant upon such a contract out of court regardless of how the character of the contract is made to appear.

In this case, even though Jim could prove that he had made a contract with Tom, and regardless of the number of witnesses Jim could call into court to swear to the terms of the contract, the contract itself was an illegal one, made for an illegal purpose, gambling, and as such the courts will refuse to enforce it.

The courts will allow great freedom to people in the making of agreements between themselves, but they draw the line when the agreement made is illegal. The courts will not aid people in breaking the law.

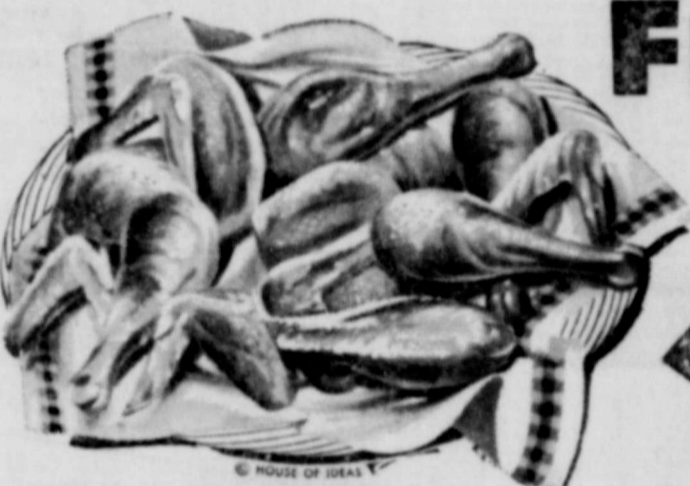

I Give You Texas
By BOYCE HOUSE

An early picture of Corpus Christi is given by an obscure second lieutenant, U. S. Grant, who was serving there with the army commanded by Gen. Zachary Taylor in 1845.

After reaching shore, or Shell Island, the labor of getting to Corpus Christi was slow and ted-

ious. There was, if my memory serves me, but one small steamer to transport troops and baggage when the Fourth Infantry arrived. Others were procured later. The distance from Shell Island to Corpus Christi was some sixteen or eighteen miles. The channel to the bay was so shallow that the steamer, small as it was, had to be dragged over the bottom when loaded. Not more than one trip a day could be effected. Later this was remedied by deepening the channel and increasing the number of vessels suitable to its navigation.

Corpus Christi is near the head of the bay of the same name,

formed by the entrance of the Nueces river into tide water, and is on the west bank of that bay. At the time of its first occupancy by United States troops, there was a small Mexican hamlet there, containing probably less than 100 souls. There was, in addition, a small American trading-post at which goods were sold to Mexican smugglers. All goods were put in compact packages of about one hundred pounds each, suitable for loading on pack mules. Two of these packages made a load for an ordinary Mexican mule and three for the larger ones. The bulk of the trade was in leaf-tobacco and domestic cotton cloths and calicoes.

The Mexicans had, before the arrival of the army, but little to offer in exchange except silver. The trade in tobacco was enormous, considering the population to be supplied. Almost every Mexican above the age of ten years, and many much younger, smoked the cigarette. Nearly every Mexican carried a pouch of leaf-tobacco, powdered by rolling in the hands, and a roll of corn-husks to make wrappers. The cigarettes were made by the smokers as they used them.

Up to the time of which I write, and for years afterward—I think until the administration of President Juarez—the cultivation, manufacture and sale of tobacco constituted a government monopoly, and paid the bulk of the revenue collected from internal sources. The price was enormously high and made smuggling very profitable. The difficulty of obtaining tobacco is probably the reason why everybody, male and female, used it at that time. I know from my own experience that, when I was at West Point, the fact that tobacco in every form was prohibited, and the mere possession of the weed severely punished, made the majority of the cadets, myself included, try to acquire the habit of using it. I failed utterly at the time and for many years afterward; but the majority accomplished the object of their youthful ambition.

(It is interesting to note that Grant had difficulty in acquiring the habit of using tobacco in view of the fact that we think of him as always smoking a cigar.)

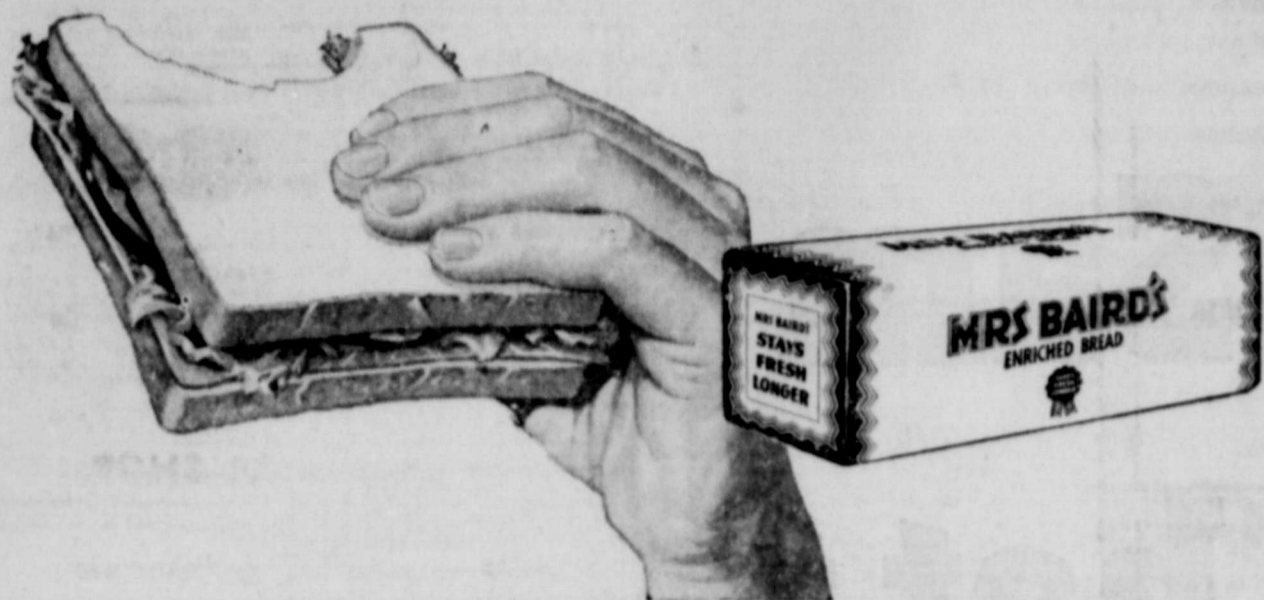

plan to be away for any length of time.

For example, a summer camp nurse may bring a boy into a hospital with an acute case of appendicitis. But the doctor may well hesitate to go ahead and operate without the parent's consent.

Is the doctor arbitrary, and is such permission just a legal technicality? No, he is well within his rights, though he may give first aid — but only for emergency treatment where a child's health or life may be at stake. He is likely to put off follow-up care until he can reach the child's parents. A relative or baby sitter generally cannot grant consent for a child's treatment.

Even an adult must request treatment and grant consent to medical care on his own before a doctor can give it to him. Children cannot do this.

By going to your doctor you show your willingness and consent to accept his treatment. Your consent is assumed also when you ask for a house call by the doctor, or if as a result of an accident you come to a hospital for emergency treatment. If you are unconscious, the doctor may well give you emergency care, yet later he should

get your consent to further treatment.

Minors cannot consent to medical treatment, and except in dire emergencies their parents or guardians must give it for them.

The consent should not be broadly or loosely phrased, but should be as specific as circumstances permit.

The principal reason for having

the consent in writing is to avoid later misunderstandings. It is a protection both to the patient and physician.

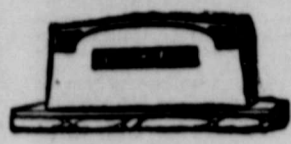


Pink and Blue Shower Honors Mrs. Murray

Celebrating the end of exams is a time-honored student tradition and Beth Hunt of Pillsbury's Junior Home Service Center knows just the way to do it—with a hearty Italian-style menu, served informally as guests check textbooks and try to figure what their grade-points will be. Even if it's been a grueling week, you'll find these recipes easy to handle:

Italian Compari Sandwiches follow the hearty "poor boy" tradition, just right for the starved feeling that comes with the knowledge that exams are really over. The individual loaves of Italian bread come out of Pillsbury refrigerated biscuit packages, like so: Place 2 cans refrigerated biscuits on edge on ungreased cookie sheet; press lightly together. Shape ends for long loaf. Brush with slightly beaten egg white. Sprinkle with sesame seeds. Bake at 350° for 30 to 40 minutes, until deep golden brown. Immediately slice loaf in half lengthwise and spread with butter. Fill with layers of cheese, salami and tomato slices, onion and green pepper rings. Top with barbecue sauce. To serve, cut in 6 to 8 sections.

Antipasto Salad is Italian-style potato salad. Combine 1 1/2 package Pillsbury Hash Brown Potatoes, 2 teaspoons salt and 6 cups water. Bring to a boil.
