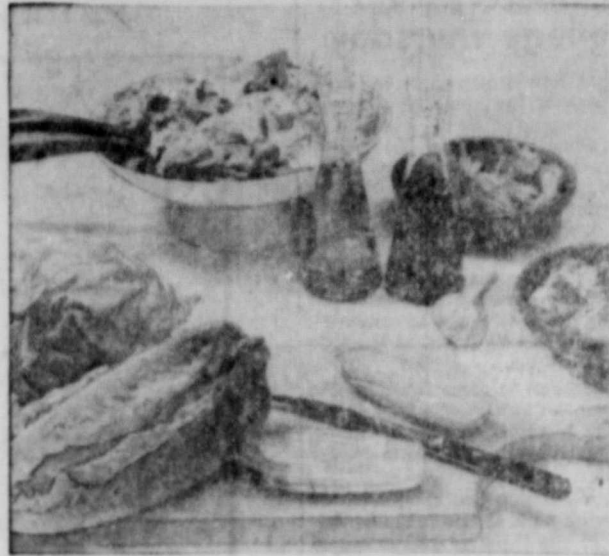

GREEN SALAD LIFTS A MEAL

Nothing adds a more satisfying contrast in texture and color to many meals than a simple green salad dressed with a lightly seasoned corn oil and vinegar dressing. The dressing gives the flip which makes the entire meal taste richer and more satisfying. Now experts on nutrition frequently recommend that vegetable oils, such as corn oil, should make up about one-third of the fat eaten each day. One easy way to get a portion of this vegetable oil is from just such a tempting salad as our Simple Green Salad with a piquant oil and vinegar dressing.

Greens should be crisp, cold and dry when making salads. Corn oil for dressing can be stored in the refrigerator. Seasonings and condiments are at their best when fresh or freshly prepared.

Simple Green Salad

Select greens for choice flavor, color, crispness and variety. Break about 4 leaves into individual bowl. Season to taste with salt and black pepper. Sprinkle one tablespoon vinegar over the greens. Toss until all greens glisten and are lightly coated. Makes 1 serving.

Vary the salad with the type

of vinegar used—elder, 1/2 5/8, tarragon, wine, or riced. There is an almost unlimited number of greens—fresh garden lettuce, Chinese cabbage, plain or curly endive, field greens, or dandelion leaves. Use dark green of small tender growth leaves and contrast to bleached or pale greens. Add chopped vegetables, too.
