His fifth recall the lays of the World War. If necessary he would have the congress Wall street create a government credit agency similar to the old war finance corporation. Americans spent billions to help make the world safe for democracy on the other side of the ocean. Now they are asked to rally to the cause of redit expansion and a guarded inflation of currency in order to do something for the people here at home.
