J. N. McFatter Seeks Reelection As Justice Peace

Justice of the Peace J. N. McFatter of Ranger has authorized this paper to announce his candidacy for re-election to the office of justice of the peace of Precinct No. 2.

Judge McFatter has been a resident of Ranger since May, 1918, and has been justice of the peace since March 8, 1920, with the exception of the 1924-25 term, when he was defeated but the man who succeeded him to office resigned and Judge McFatter was appointed to fill his place.

Since his appointment to fill the unexpired term, Judge McFatter has served continuously in the office.

The justice of the peace is well known throughout his district and has made many friends while he has held the office. In seeking re-election he points to his long service in the office and the fact that he is well qualified in every way to retain the office.

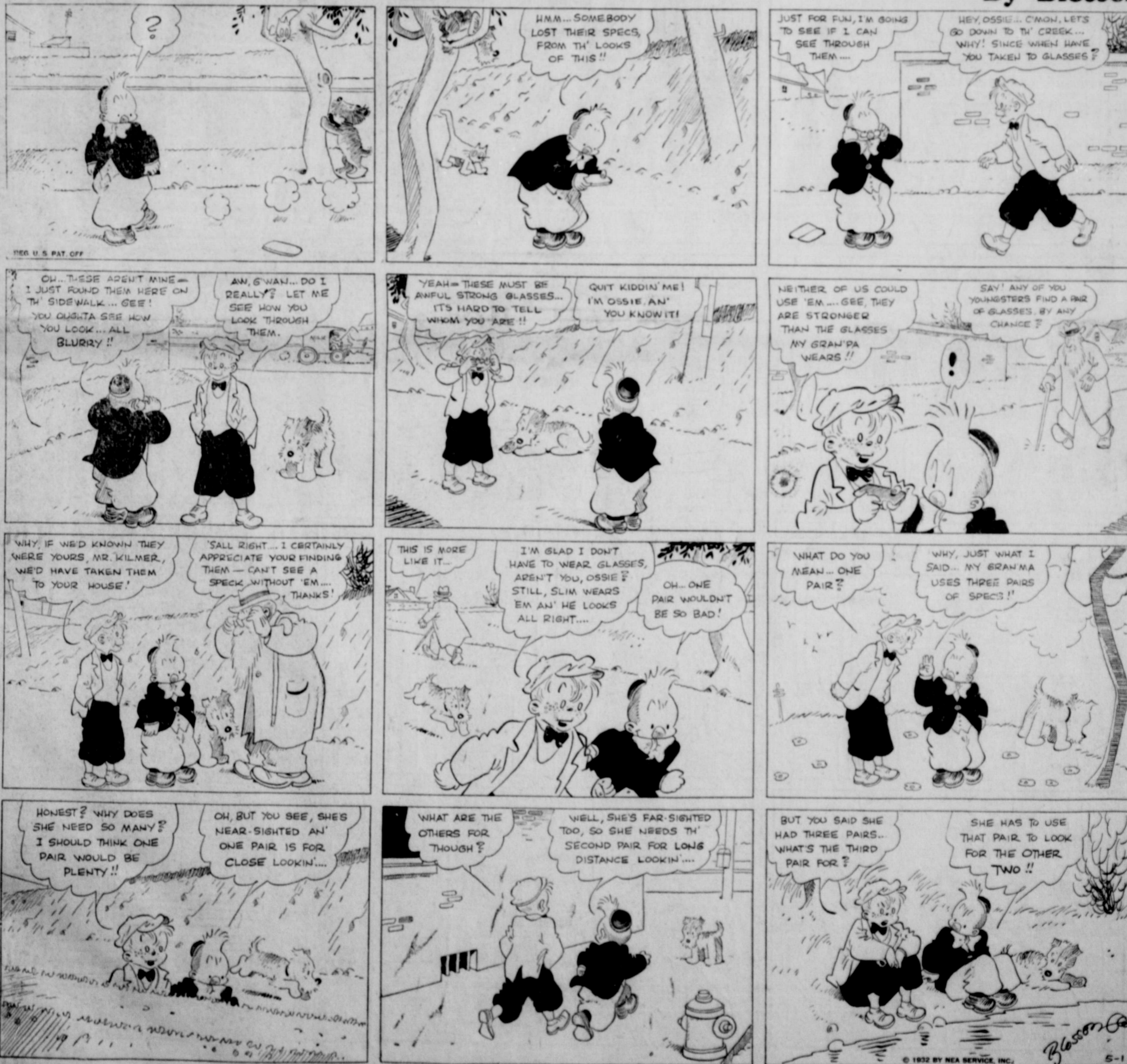

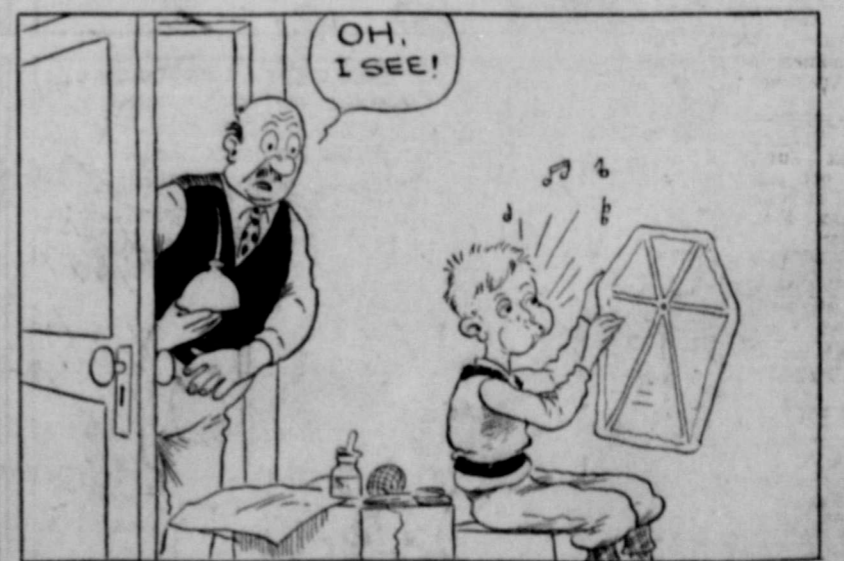
