NEWS from YOUR COUNTY AGRICULTURAL AGENT FOR FOOD FOR VICTORY

D. S. Bruton has reported good kills on prairie dogs using poison grain. He reported seeing over 200 dead prairie dogs and came back after more prairie dog poison grain to kill the rest of his dogs. Everyone thus far this spring is getting good results in killing prairie dogs which means they will have more grass and crops for livestock instead of prairie dogs.

Rabbits still seem to be causing a lot of trouble in soybeans and vegetables in gardens. There are two methods of poisoning rabbits, by the use of block salt and poison grain. If poison grain is used fresh mounds of dirt about six inches high should be made near rabbit runways to attract their attention. The poison grain should be placed on these mounds. The salt blocks can be made by using 15 pounds of salt, 5 pounds of alfalfa meal, 2 1/2 ozs. of strychnine (alkaloid) 2 1/2 ozs. of soda. This should be mixed or if smaller amounts in the same proportion. This can be put in 2 in. holes bored in a two by four which can be fastened to the ground near the

Marine Corps Has Opening For No. of Men-Women

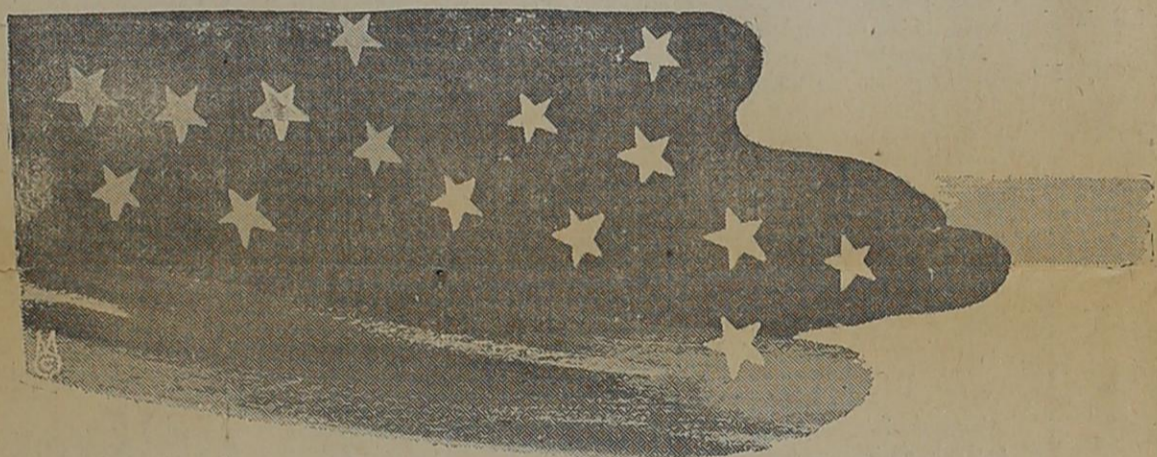
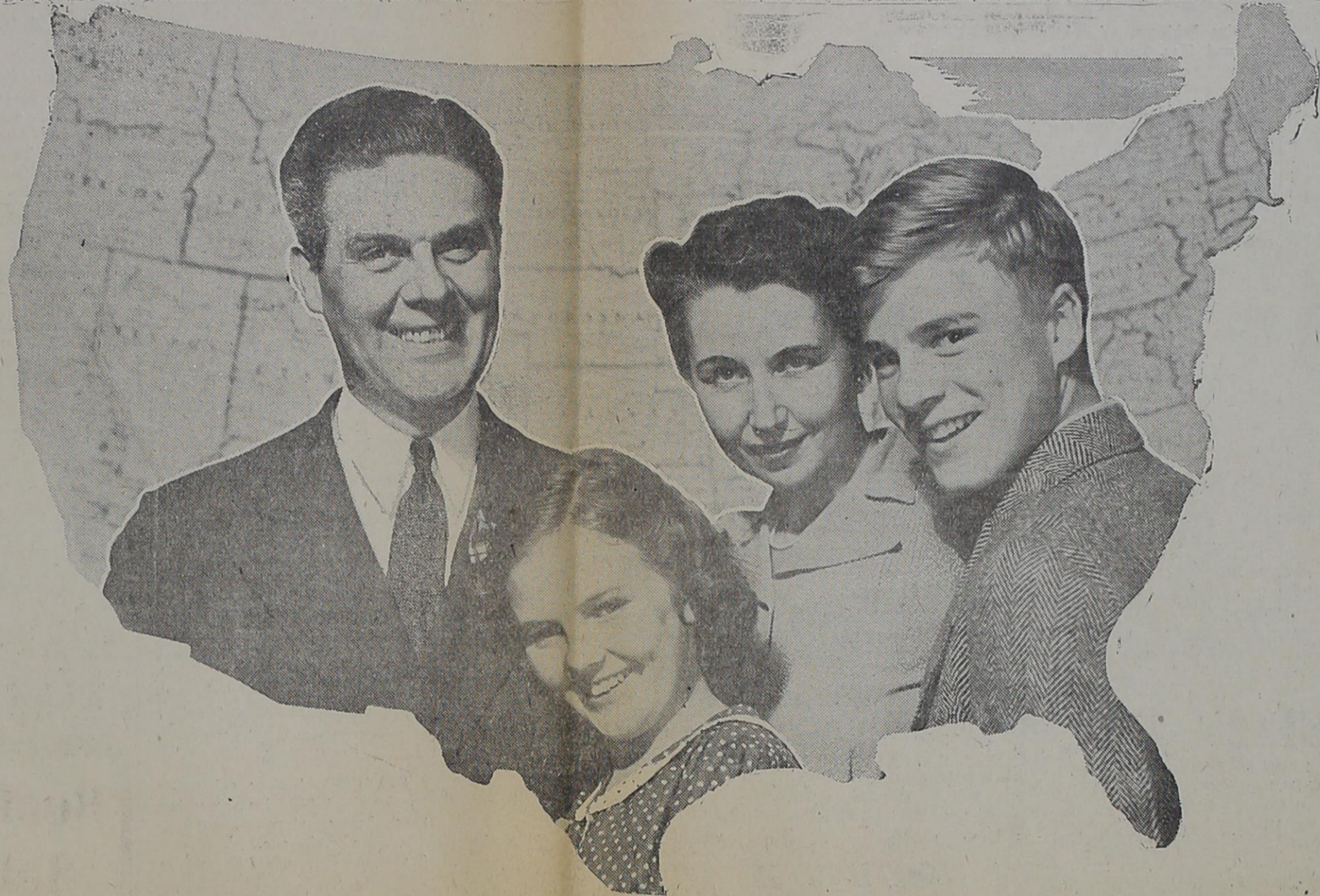
