## News of Our Neighbors

**CHILDRESS**—A new industry will move here from New York City. The new industry, a metal moulding company, has made arrangements to lease a building in the city for a 20 year period. Plans call for some 40 employees and the plant opens with the likelihood that 125 to 150 will be employed within a year. The Childress plant would be used to supply Texas, the Southwest, Middle-west and West Coast.

**MULEDOO**—Sixty-three seniors received diplomas at commencement exercises at the high school May 27. Myra Hogan was named valedictorian of the graduating class and Billy Wagon was second salutatorian honor. This is one of the largest classes ever to graduate at the high school.

**SILVERTON**—Plans are complete for the three-day rodeo that will be held here May 29-30-31. A complete new arena and pens have been built for the event. Trophies will be presented to all winners. Entries have already been received from New Mexico, Oklahoma and several points in Texas.

**OLTON**—Identical twins were the valedictorian and salutatorian of Olton High School, which graduated 44 seniors at commencement services last week. Doris Gray took the valedictorian award and her twin sister, Dorothy, received the salutatorian award.

**CHILLICOTIE**—Twenty-four seniors will receive diplomas at the high school graduation exercises here. Lee Kennedy compiled the best four-year average to be named class valedictorian while Granville Brazg was runner-up to share salutatorian honors.

**COLORADO CITY**—This city rolled up its sleeves and gave 151 pints of blood when the Red Cross Mobile came to town recently. The blood went to supply military and civil emergency needs and help furnish gamma globulin at the fight against polio. A total of 151 residents contributed their blood.

as a people who want justice to prevail, we like to think that every man, rich or poor, shall have his day in court. This is an important right, for a day in court implies more than merely the right to have your say before a judge and jury. It implies that you shall have the right to be properly represented, to have your case presented before an impartial jury and an unbiased judge, and to have a reasonable time to prepare for trial. It holds that you shall have proper notice of the action against you, that the complaint or indictment shall state a clear case of action. It means that you shall be confronted by your accusers; that you shall have the right to cross-examine them; that you shall be able to present evidence in your own behalf.

WALTER ROGERS' WASHINGTON NEWSLETTER

POOD, FIBER, FUEL AND FIREPOWER: You will hear and read much in the next few months about economies, proposed economies, budget balancing, tax reduction, the elimination of waste and craft, and other incidental items. It presently appears from the recent announcements of congressional leaders that the proposals to balance the budget and reduce taxes will be continued to talk for about two years. These announcements are confirmed by the action that is being taken by Congress on the appropriations

part of Interior is the caretaker of the real property of the Government and has the responsibility of developing the natural resources. The Appropriations Committee has passed 202 million dollars out of the 200 million dollar cut of the Budget Reclamation funds. 90 million dollars of the 98 million dollar cut represented a reduction in construction, rehabilitation, and matters incident thereto. General administrative expenses were reduced one million dollars. The nature of this cut simply means that there will be a sharp curtailment in maintenance, operation and rehabilitation of existing facilities in this country and a sharp curtailment in the development of our natural resources. At the same time, the taxpayers of this country are being asked to contribute to foreign aid. Much of this money will be used for the development of natural resources in the countries to which it is sent. Some may take issue with me on this point and say that the dollars are not used directly for that purpose. Such a statement would be true, but it is only theoretical. What happens is this: The recipients of foreign aid in many instances use their own funds, called counterpart funds, to develop their natural resources. They use the funds furnished by this country for the purposes for which they would have had to use their own funds had this country not sent the foreign aid. It is sort of a merry-go-round. No one objects to helping other countries who are our allies. However, I cannot reconcile the development of the natural resources in other countries at the expense of permitting ours to go unattended. Many of these foreign countries are under a communist or socialist government. Should any of them capitulate, we know that the assets we have provided for those countries would not only be lost to us, but would be used against us.

The cold hard facts that we must face are simple these. The survival of this country from a material standpoint is going to depend upon food, fiber, fuel and firepower. This means that agriculture, the development of our natural resources, and the strengthening of our defenses should be among our top level considerations. The fat should be cut from all of these, but the muscles should not be damaged. SUBSIDIES: I expect to introduce a resolution within the next few days requesting a full investigation and a definite earmarking of the subsidies enjoyed at the expense of the American taxpayer. One of the most difficult problems at present is to find out the exact amount subsidies being paid, who gets them and why. It is high time

Draft Deferment Can Carry Penalty

(3rd in a series) Young men of draft age who ask for and get deferments under certain conditions automatically extend the time during which they can be drafted by nine years. Brig. Gen. Paul L. Wakefield, state draft director, names the following types of deferred men, among others, who have their liability for service extended until age 35: 1. Members of the ROTC and other officer training programs. 2. Students deferred to go to high school or college under requirements of law; college students deferred under authority of the local board. 3. Men left at home for civilian employment. 4. Men deferred to farm. 5. Married men deferred because of their children or because of extreme hardship and privation to dependents. 6. Men classified as mentally, physically, or morally deficient or defective. The regulations spell this out," General Wakefield says. "So when a man gets the privilege of deferment he is taking on the corresponding responsibility. The man who never receives a deferment like these cannot be drafted after he reaches his 26th birthday." The state draft director says that, under this provision of law, it is possible for a deferred man to lose his qualification for deferment at age 34, for example. Under such circumstances, he would again be eligible for draft.

SMALL BUSINESS

A plan to solve newspaper problem is before Congress. Background data supporting the proposed legislation was presented to the Senate Small Business Committee study of newspaper situation about a year ago. Facts were found, for example, that the U. S. press depends on circulation for 5/6 of its newspaper supply to operate as a monopoly. It is time for action, says C. W. Hendon, Sen. Francis Case (Rep. S. D.). He has introduced a bill that will permit a newspaper industry to be organized as a public utility.

NATIONAL GUARD: A storm of protest has been stirred up in Texas by a proposal that, if put into effect, would probably kill the National Guard. At present a Governor has the right to issue a proclamation stating that enlistment in the National Guard of young men under 18 1/2 years of age is necessary to maintain the Guard's strength. These enlistees cannot then be drafted. Dr. John A. Hannah, Assistant Secretary of Defense, has suggested this authority be cancelled. He said two million trained reservists are available to maintain the strength of the Guard. But Texas Adjutant General K. L. Berry says the reservists "simply will not enlist." The only way, General Berry declared, "to maintain our strength is to be able to enlist under 18 1/2 years old."
