

Truck loads of wheat began to wend their way to Castro county elevators this week as the 1934 harvest was begun.

The most disappointing facor this year is the price, grain bringing 65c a bushel. A great deal of Castro county

wheat was destroyed by hail in he last three weeks. Many farmers are expressing

disappointment at their yields saving that fields which were expected to produce 12 to 15 bushels are making from 5 to 8. Other expected yields are running in proportion.


