#### Tragedy of Real Life Suppressed on Stage

That perserve imp of fate who enjoys seeing honest men make spectacles of themselves must have timed this murder trial at Wise, Va., to come just as the play "Tobacco Road" was up for public discussion.

The play, as you have doubtless heard, is an unvarnished picture of the dreadful things which can happen in the lives of isolated poor whites. Because its picture is so ugly, the mayors of certain American cities have refused to let the play be performed.

Right on the heels of this comes this Virginia mountain trial, in which a young woman named Edith Maxwell was convicted of first degree murder for battering in her father's head with a shoe after he had taken butcher knife and club to her for staying out with a boy friend later than 9 p. m.

The testimony in this trial doesn't make pleasant reading, but you might take just a glance at it and charge it up

Edith came home to her parents' mountain shack and found pappy drunk. Pappy announced that he was going to whip her for staying out late; she replied that he could whip her when he was sober, but not when drunk. So he seized the nearest weapons and fell to.

The scene that followed is the sort of thing which we jermit to happen in real life, but at which we balk when someone tries to use it in dramatic literature. The drunken mountaineer gets the girl by the hair, rips her clothing nearly off, forces her down on the floor, mouthing threats.

She grabs the nearest weapon-a shoe, it happened to be-and flails him on the head with the heel. His grasp relaxes, at last, and she escapes, leaving pappy dazedly muttering, "Jesus, why can't a man whip his own child!"


It would be silly, of course, to say that this sort of thing is in any way typical of the mountain folks as a group, any more than a play like "Tobacco Road" is typical of southern poor whites as a group.

But both things, the trial and the play, show the price that our society does have to pay now and then for permitting backwaters of poverty and bleak ignorance to

The righteous mayors who refused to let their constituents have a look at the play doubtless felt that they were saving America from something pretty dreadful. Unfortunately, fate chose that moment to hand them the double cross by offering an equally mean and repellant drama from real life.

We don't get anywhere by shutting our eyes to evils. Frightful things can happen in this world when we let isolation and wont grind people down to primeval brutality. We can suppress things like "Tobacco Road"; we don't seem able to suppress things like this Virginia tragedy.
