MEMPHIS, Tenn.—Crime could e materially reduced and social, ligious and economic standards the nation greatly improved if white man would adopt and oflow some of the creeds of the American Indian, according to Ernest Thompson Seton, presient of the Seton Institute at San-

The institute, which is devoted to preservation of the fore and culture of American Indians, has een under direction of the 78ear-old author, puinter and lecurer since it was founded.

Seton believes the Indian never has been rightfully presented to the public. He says that the red ran is not a bloodthirsty savage, as motion pictures and books would have the public believe.

"In arts and culture, the red man has far exceeded the white man," Seton said. "He has a religous tolerance and it would be well for the rest of the world dopt it. He had a rhythm in his ongs and dances the white man has never been able to equal.

'Until the white man invaded these shores, the redskin did not know dishonesty. His morals were higher then than they are today after the white man's vices and creeds were introduced. They had a creed that they fol-







Having been asked to give a resume of our year's work at Calvary Baptist church, without appearing to be boasting, as pastor, I'm happy indeed to give out the following

In March of last year our Sunday school attendance was some hing like 75; so great has been our growth, we now have an attendance of 300, and are expecting 400 in Sunday rehool Christmas Day. In June we organized our church, as an independent, New Testament, cooperating, old time religion church, and we are climbing toward 300 members already. 





