Ranger Lake Case Given Preference On Court Calendar

An appeal to the Third Court of Civil Appeals at Austin, filed by the City of Strawn in an effort to prevent building of a city water supply lake near Ranger, has been given preference on the court calendar, it was stated today by L. R. Pearson, who filed the motion to have the hearing advanced. The appeal by Strawn was from a lower court ruling that the court did not have jurisdiction over permits granted by the State Board of Water Engineers. The appeal was the outcome of an attempt by the City of Strawn to prevent building of a lake and water supply system for the City of Ranger. The lower court ruled that it had no jurisdiction in the case, and an appeal was filed by the City of Strawn. The action by the appeals court this week sets the case up earlier on the court calendar, so that it will likely come up sometime in October, instead of later in the year or early next year, Pearson stated today.

Entrants In Model Airplane Contests Will Meet Thursday

Entrants in the model airplane contests, to be staged at the Ranger Airport Sunday, Sept. 24, under the sponsorship of the Ranger Lions Club, will meet at the airport immediately after school Thursday afternoon, it was stated today by C. J. Moore. Entrants will meet to test out their planes under actual contest conditions, and to formulate rules under which the contests are to be staged. A large number of valuable prizes are to be offered in both gasoline and rubber band models, as well as on appearance.

Flood Control To be Sought By Town

PRESIDIO, Tex.—An appropriation for flood protection work in the vicinity of Presidio on the Rio Grande may be sought in the next session of congress. Assistant Secretary of State Sumner Welles, in a letter to Rep. R. E. Thomson, D., Tex., suggested that the work be done by a federal relief agency under supervision of the International Boundary Commission. The commission has been making a study of work necessary to protect property along the river. It has been estimated that an emergency project will cost about \$200,000. No funds for levees work in the Presidio area are provided in current federal appropriations. Money for the project must be sought in a congressional
