

To prepare youngsters against susceptibility to disease later in life, steps must be taken early. Many schools are already giving their pupils regular periods of physical intraction and exercices. The Youth Commission feels these activities are not widespread enough. The boys and girls who are most in need of exercise usually pass up gymnasium classes because they are not adept in physical edu-

The teaching of hygiene and preventative measures is also in need of considerable expansion, the commission contends. The results of a recent survey conducted reveal ed only about 10 per cent of all students received hygiene nstruction in high school or college. Another recommendation is a regular system of frequent physical examinations to detect disease or potential disease at the earliest stage
