#### Where Do We Stand Now?

France is fallen. Britain can do no more than to make a last-ditch stand. No one can now challenge Germany's domination of Europe.

What does this mean to the United States?

money saving beauty of the lowest price cars! First, there need be no regret that we backed France. It was the decent, humane, civilized thing to do. We need not regret having backed Britain, for the same reason. There is no reason not to continue to back her as long as

But that is no reason to fool ourselves. We face a new Surope, for better or for worse.

The question of the French possessions in the West Indies is immediate. French Guiana, Guadeloupe, and Martinique are within easy bombing distance of the Panama Canal. They must not be permitted to fall into the hands of Germany. Neither must St. Pierre and Miquelon, which are equally close to New England.

Our blanket promise to defend all South America looks tougher day by day. Caribbean Central America and Northern South America we must defend simply because to defend them on what we can do, and on what those countries seem willing to do for themselves. Canada we must defend from invasion and occupation as we would defend ourselves. There is no choice.

In the Far East, vast French and British possessions are now exposed to hazards. Exactly what our interests are in hose regions is subject to serious debate. In the meantime no responsibilities ought to be undertaken there which we are not prepared instantly to enforce to the letter.

Plans are already under way to meet the challenge of trade which will come when all the exports of Europe are handled through a central German clearing-house. Insofar as we meet that challenge, we must adopt similar tacties.

But it will mean less foreign trade. We must despite our principles, become more self-contained.

Amid all these uncertainties, one thing is quite clear: we must without delay build military defenses of all kinds on a scale we never thought possible. In a world which speaks only the language of force and violence, we must learn that language, and speak it with authority






