TESTED TO AID CHUTE TROOPS

By ROBERT INNES United Press Staff Correspondent MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. - Uniersity of Minnesota physiologists are conducting diet experiments n an attempt to supply army parachute troops with a day's ra-
