SMALL MANUFACTURER BECOMING IMPORTANT IN DEFENSE PROGRAM

**BECAUSE HE HAS SMALL PLANT IS NO REASON A
MANUFACTURER CANNOT GET GOVERNMENT
CONTRACTS UNDER THE DEFENSE SETUP**

DALLAS. — Small and medium-sized manufacturers are becoming increasingly important in the war effort—but, how do such manufacturers go about getting war work?

The biggest mistake any manufacturer can make is to assume he hasn't a chance of getting war contracts.

There are things he can do to get them. The War Production Board has set up administrative machinery to help him by making full use of this machinery and supplementing it with determination and ingenuity, many manufacturers will bridge the gap—often a wide one—between non-essential and essential production.

A complete survey of his facilities is the first step of every manufacturer who wants war work. This survey should begin with the firm's business record and should include a description of normal products made in the plant, the experience of managerial and supervisory personnel, previous war production experience, a financial statement and names of past and present customers for reference.

The manufacturer should take stock of his labor situation. In the survey, he should list the number of his factory employees, their skills, peak employment of the plant for one, two and three shifts, a description of the available labor supply and the competition for it, and a brief analysis of existing and nearby wage rates.

Then he should take stock of the plant and its equipment, describing location, transportation facilities, available power and water facilities and similar production factors.

Complete layout plans, accompanied by photographs, should be made of each section of the plant. Finally, a list of all tools should be made in which the type, make, size and serial number, as well as the tolerances usually followed, are included.

Since the survey is to serve as a guide both to himself and to those from whom the manufacturer must get his contracts, it must be adequate and complete. Since a complete survey is often expensive, the manufacturer ought to make full use of it.

His survey will do him the most good at the following places:

1. The nearest field office of the Contract Distribution Branch of the War Production Board. (There are 115 offices scattered throughout the country.) Here a manufacturer can learn what war items are needed and get an idea of which he can make. He can study blueprints and samples. At some offices he will see exhibits of needed bits and pieces in which the prime contractors display actual parts and sub assemblies they may want to farm out. Since the offices serve as a clearing-house of information for government procurement offices and prime contractors, the manufacturer should keep in close touch with the office serving his district.

2. The Army's district procurement office. By writing to the Office of the Under-Secretary of the War Department in Washington, the manufacturer may get a copy of "Army Purchase Information Bulletin," which contains the addresses of the various procurement offices, the type of products they buy and the procedure to be followed in getting orders.

3. The Navy's Bureau of Supplies and Accounts. A booklet, "Selling to the Navy," is just what its title indicates, and may be obtained by writing to the Bureau at the Navy Department in Washington.

4. Local prime contractors. As firms which now have contracts become more and more "loaded," they will become increasingly interested in the facilities of every plant that can help them fill their contracts. Addresses and other information can be obtained by bona fide manufacturers at Contract Distribution offices.

API 1942 Mid-Year Meeting Cancelled

OKLAHOMA CITY.—The 12th Mid-Year Meeting of the American Petroleum Institute, scheduled for May 25-28 at Oklahoma City, will not be held, W. R. Boyd, Jr., API president, has announced.

Extreme demands of the war upon the vital petroleum industry, which is supplying explosives, synthetic rubber, glycerine, ethyl alcohol, and many other synthetic raw materials made from crude oil, as well as unprecedented quantities of its normal products, and the solution of an ever-increasing transportation problem, are keeping members of the Institute and its working committees so actively engaged that the Institute's executive committee, upon recommendation by President Boyd, decided to cancel the meeting.

"From top to bottom, the personnel of the petroleum industry is busy with war work," Mr. Boyd said. "Hundreds of oil men, particularly those who are most active in the committee work of the Institute, already are actually overloaded, and it has been thought wise to cancel the Mid-Year Meeting."

Mid-Year meetings of the Institute, which have been held annually since 1931, customarily include group sessions on refining and production problems, and nearly a hundred committee meetings, where progress in petroleum technology is reported. No plans have been made for meeting at a later date, Mr. Boyd said.

Eastland County Boy Enters Four Hogs At Ft. Worth

Billy Joe Moore, of Route 2, Eastland, has entered four Poland China hogs in the Southwest Exposition and Fat Stock Show in Fort Worth March 13-22. Premiums totaling \$4,564 are being offered in the boys livestock division of the show this year. More than \$38,000 is being awarded in all livestock divisions at the show.

Real rodeo world championship rough again will headline the 1942 show which opens Friday, March 13, with a two-mile long "Roundup for Victory" parade through the downtown district of Fort Worth.

Elvie Greenfield Dies At Dermott

Mrs. J. R. Crossley, Eastland county jailer, has just returned from Dermott where she attended the funeral of her brother, Elvie Greenfield, who died in a Snyder hospital Tuesday. Interment was at Dermott.

The deceased, who died on his 56th birthday, lived in Eastland as a boy and attended the Eastland public schools. He left with his parents 63 years ago and since that time he and the family have resided at Dermott. He is survived by his widow, five children, and a number of brothers and sisters including Mrs. Crossley.

COLUMBUS, O.—Five years ago pretty Roberta Burger came to Ohio State University to master pharmacy and cure humanity's ills with pills.

Miss Burger, the first girl graduate of the special OSU course in the chemical composition of high explosives, attended night school and paid her expenses with a day-time job.

BRITISH MOVE NORTHWARD TO AID MANDALAY

MANDELAY, Burma, Feb. 26.—British forces fought stubbornly against strong Japanese drive toward Rangoon today, and were believed to be pivoting northward to form a new east-west defense line protecting the approaches to Mandalay.

The All India radio reported that no new developments had been reported on the Burma Front. It said that two Japanese air raids were reported from Rangoon, and that 21 Japanese planes had been shot down in the past 24 hours.

Japanese forces were said to be moving north along the east bank of the Sittang River, presumably as a result of the British pivoting movement.

Rangoon, itself, was reported to be burning from British demolitions carried out under the scorched earth policy.

Eastland To Save \$4,736 Because Of Its Fire Record

Eastland continues to maintain a splendid fire record. This is revealed in a recent report by Marvin Hall, State Fire Insurance Commissioner, in which he gives the fire record credit for 24 Texas towns.

Gorman is also shown to have a good fire record.

A saving on fire insurance during the 12 months beginning March 1 will approximate \$165,000 in 56 towns listed and in which Eastland and Gorman are included.

Eastland has a 25 per cent credit and the estimated saving to property owners because of this credit is \$4,736.00, while that for Gorman, which also has a 25 per cent credit, is \$1,331.00.

Twenty-five per cent credit is the maximum that any town can have. Eastland has maintained this credit for the past two years.

Daylight Saving Saves No Current Over Panhandle

AMARILLO, Tex. — Daylight savings time was designed to preserve, among other things, electric current.

Yet in this Panhandle city, daylight savings time cost the public an extra 81 cents daily—for light.

It came about when citizens asked that white wall lights be turned on from 7 a. m. to 8:15 a. m. The business district was extremely dark during those hours it was said.

The lights were turned off an hour earlier in the evening leaving an extra 15 minutes daily to be paid for.

Jack Cunningham of the Southwestern Public Service Company estimated that the charges would amount to 81 cents daily for the extra service.

When the days lengthen, however, the morning service will be discontinued.

Blacksmith Vital In Armored Unit

FORT KNOX, Ky.—The "villeg blacksmith" still swings his heavy hammer before a roaring forge at armored force headquarters and he is an indispensable servant of mechanized war.

The spreading chestnut tree has yielded to a modern roof and the forge is electric, but the smith's labor hard follows and heavier labor than Longfellow's character, who tapped out horseshoes.

Members of the blacksmiths' and welders' division of the armored force learn to straighten fenders and bumpers and repair parts of vehicles ranging from "jeeps" and "peeps" to heavy tanks.

Training of the men who "keep 'em rolling" is rigorous. Classes are small and if a man does not complete his training in a satisfactory manner, he goes right back to the beginning to learn the fundamentals of heat treating, annealing and shaping of steel.

Most of the work at the base is repair of staff cars and trucks, but on the battlefield the blacksmiths must know how to weld cracked motor blocks and make other vital repairs on 54 types of vehicles used by the force.

Class Proves Coin Tossing Doesn't Pay

SHREVEPORT, La. — High school students flipped coins in a science class recitation period, but the teacher didn't mind.

It was an experiment to illustrate a phase of the laws of chance.

Six thousand coins were pitched into the air and let fall. Tails turned up 3,007 times, heads 2,993 times.

AIR WARNING SERVICE GETS NEW PRIORITY

AUSTIN, Texas. — Completion of the Aircraft Warning Service organization in Texas has been given priority among defense activities of the National Defense Committee for Texas, Governor Coke Stevenson announced today.

This Service includes observation posts which will report the approach of hostile planes and filter and information centers through which these reports will reach the Army.

Approximately 24,700 volunteer observers have already been enrolled for duty at these observation posts, Governor Stevenson said, and additional reports are coming in daily. Members of the Governor's staff, assisted by representatives of the United States Employment Service and the Texas Department of Public Safety, are now visiting various sections of the State in connection with this activity.

The Governor announced that the Aircraft Warning Service had been completed in the following counties: Brazos, Calhoun, Chambers, Fayette, Gregg, Hardin, Marion, Rusk, San Augustine, San Jacinto, Titus, Trinity, Walker, Atascosa, Bastrop, Coryell, Deaf Smith, Falls, Kennedy, Kimble, Lamar, Potter, and Willacy.

The Army will operate filter and information centers in San Antonio, Houston, and Dallas, and the State defense organization has been asked to provide 1,300 women volunteers to man these centers under the Army's direction.

The local defense organizations in those three cities have been asked by the Governor to take the lead in enrolling these volunteers. Representatives of the United States Employment Service are assisting in the personal interviewing which is required.

Mayor Hears Talk By Sam Russell On Congress Pensions

Mayor Hall Walker, who is visiting in Washington, has wired the Ranger Times, as follows:

"I heard our honorable congressman, Sam Russell, make an important speech against the pension bill for congressmen and senators, which passed a few days ago while our congressman and some others were working on important committees. I saw congress vote it down yesterday. Congressman Russell wished to keep government expenses at a minimum, yet is willing to vote enough money to win the war."

In the course of his remarks, as published in the Congressional Record, Congressman Sam Russell said:

"I do not know what course other members desire to take, but for me I want it said that I consider myself a servant of the people, and not an employee of the Government. To serve my people at any time is an honor to me. The fact that I am permitted to serve and represent them during the darkest days that I have ever known—such service is compensation in itself."

"Since passage of this act I have listened closely to the arguments of the sponsors and the members who favored this bill, and only a few arguments have been put forth in support of same. After I have analyzed these arguments I am of the opinion that when fully considered it should not meet with the approval of a single member."

"I believe we should go the Nathan Hale way and give everything now to the cause we are engaged in, and forget that money to us as individuals plays any part in it. Money is a means of exchange, but it cannot buy patriotism. It cannot buy a willingness to shed the blood that flows in our American veins for the country we love. Let us resolve to do our part to help keep our beautiful land free and independent, free from those who desire to destroy the integrity, the honesty, the beauty of American ideals handed down to us by generations of Americans who fought for them, died for them, who gave us the heritage to carry on. Let our answer be 'Yes, for America we will; God helping us, we can do no other.'"

MANY DRIVERS LICENSE WILL EXPIRE APR. 1

Have you renewed your drivers license?

If not it is time you were getting the matter attended to as all licenses bearing numbers under 900,001 expire and must be renewed before April 1. Drivers failing to renew their existing license before the expiration date will be required to stand an examination before new license may be issued.

Months under 18 years of age renewing licenses must have supporting affidavits signed by their fathers. If the father is deceased then the mother may sign the affidavit.

Minors under 18 years of age must have supporting letters from the county judge of their home county.

All applicants for renewal of licenses, members of the Department of Public Safety, State Highway Department, state, should be sure to follow directions and instructions on renewal applications.

Favoritism By The Navy Is Charged By Representative

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 26 Representative William T. Phiffer, Republican, New York, charged in the House today that Lieut. Franklin D. Roosevelt, son of the president, was being accorded "favored treatment by the United States Navy."

Phiffer said that young Roosevelt was given a month's shore leave after he underwent an appendectomy last week. Similar treatment, he charged, would not be accorded sons of poor families.

He asserted that "favored treatment" was generally granted to sons of prominent families by the Navy. He added that naval commissions have been given to favored youths "on a silver platter."

New Cold Wave Is Due Before Friday

Another cold wave, coming directly on the heels of the present cold weather, will strike most of Texas by tonight, the United States Weather Bureau warned today.

Much colder weather, with freezing weather prevailing nearly to the Gulf Coast, was forecast. The Rio Grande Valley was expected to escape the cold wave for tonight, at least.

A hard freeze was predicted in the northern portion of the state, with livestock warnings being issued for that section.

ALLIES TAKE A HEAVY TOLL OF AXIS SHIPS

American and British armed forces struck punishing new blows at the Axis in the Pacific, Atlantic and Mediterranean today, but the Japanese rolled forward in their Burma and Java offensives.

Land, sea and air fighters of the United States took a leading role in the new attacks that inflicted what Secretary of War Henry L. Stimson described as "appalling loss" of life on the Japanese in addition to sinking or damaging seven submarines in the Atlantic.

Latest dispatches from the fighting fronts showed:

In Java the American Flying Fortress battered the newly-arrived Japanese invasion fleet, including cruisers and destroyers, off the southeast coast of enemy-held Bali, only one mile from Java. A United States submarine torpedoed two enemy transports, an auxiliary ship, a freighter and probably a warship in two days of attacks upon the invaders.

In the Philippines Gen. Douglas MacArthur's forces on Bataan Peninsula, in a surprise counter attack, drove back the Japanese and captured enemy positions in an advance of several miles. The fighting in the Bataan Sector still continues, a War Department communique stated.

In London First Lord of the Admiralty A. V. Alexander disclosed that the 10,000-ton Nazi cruiser of the Prinz Eugen class was heavily damaged by a British submarine attack off the Norwegian Coast while photographs taken by the Royal Air Force indicate that the battle cruisers Scharnhorst and Gneisenau had been knocked out for some time and were laid up at Kiel and Wilhelmshaven.

The Admiralty also reported that three Italian convoy ships had been sunk in naval engagements in the Mediterranean.

What Is a Hoarder?

A hoarder is a person who wants to have an edge over his fellow citizens to the extent of having an abundant supply of things on hand where there are not sufficient stocks available to supply all his neighbors during a wartime emergency.

That is the definition given by a group of New York merchants advertising against hoarding "in the interest of intelligent buying and patriotic behavior."

It's a pretty good definition. The boys crouching in the muddy foxholes of Bataan could probably say it with more force and color, but it's still just as damning as it is dignified.

Are you a hoarder?
Are you buying up sugar so you'll have an "edge" over that mother whose son died at Pearl Harbor?
Are you a hoarder?
Are you grabbing girlies off department store counters because you fear a shortage and want to make sure you have yours, even if there's none left a month from now for that pretty girl down the street whose husband flew for MacArthur?

If you hoard, remember you are able to over-buy only because (1) you have enough money; (2) your selfish desires overcome your patriotic impulses. By hoarding you take advantage of your neighbor, your country—and yourself.

Hoarding begets more hoarding. If you foresee a shortage of pants or peanuts, the one sure method of aggravating that potential shortage and bringing rationing is to rush all over town buying up stocks and boasting to one and all of your foresight. By hoarding you bring on rationing and possible hardships that might be avoided.

Hoarding is unpatriotic. But conserving what you now have is just as patriotic as buying defense bonds or working harder longer or volunteering for civilian defense. Don't waste. Take care of what you have. Buy only what you really need—now.

When the final history of this war is written, will it be recorded that America lost? That America lost because most of her people remained apathetic toward the war effort and the only ones to arouse from complacency were those who lathered themselves into the hysteria of hoarding?

Road Bond Policy Of Commission Has Been Fixed

AUSTIN.—To prevent a possible default in payment of county and road district bonds previously assumed by the state where used in the construction of state highways, the Highway Commission has announced that it will decline to take advantage of the provisions of the bond assumption law passed last September under which several millions of dollars of county and district bonds could now be used for new state highway construction.

The action of the Commission was taken in anticipation of a heavy decline in revenues from the gasoline tax due to restricted travel during the war emergency. The Commission stated it was impossible to calculate correctly the amount of income to the road bond redemption fund from one cent of the gasoline tax set aside for service obligations made eligible by previous legislation and

that it was unwilling to place additional burdens on the road bond fund in the face of declining revenues.

The law permits the Highway Commission to accept county and road district funds from bond issues where the issues were voted prior to Jan. 2, 1939. Proceeds from those bonds, when used on state highway construction, would be eligible for payment from the road bond fund on the same basis as bonds assumed under the original law passed in 1932 and its subsequent amendments. The statement of Commission policy was issued by D. C. Greer, state highway engineer, who also is chairman of the Board of County and District Road Indebtedness.

It also was pointed out that as a result of the war there was a critical deficiency in many of the materials needed in heavy highway construction and that highway construction costs had increased substantially. More economical construction would be obtained after the war when prices return to their former levels, the Commission indicated.

dustry will necessarily bring about a substantial reduction in the gasoline tax revenues for the duration of the war," the Commission stated. "It appears that such reductions in revenue will present a most serious problem to the Board of County and District Road Indebtedness in providing funds for servicing of bonds heretofore assumed by the state. Therefore, it shall be the policy of the Commission to refrain from the acceptance of funds from bond issues in so far as the Highway Commission is concerned all future construction of roads shall be on a 'pay as you go' basis from funds currently available."

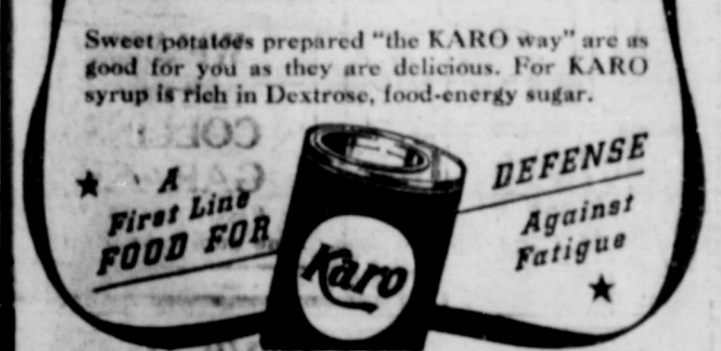
The Commission directed that a copy of its statement of policy be sent to all county officials with the suggestion that "a similar study of the individual counties be made with the expectation that such studies will reveal to the county officials that bond issues for the construction of roads are not advisable, at least under the present conditions."

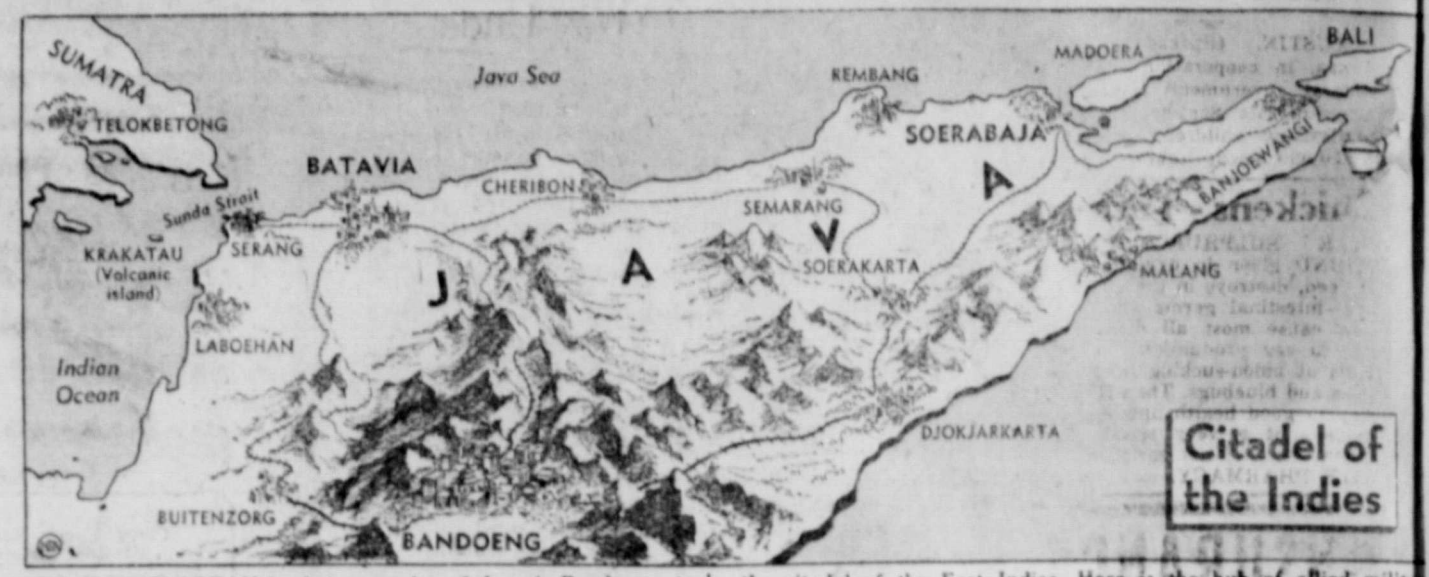

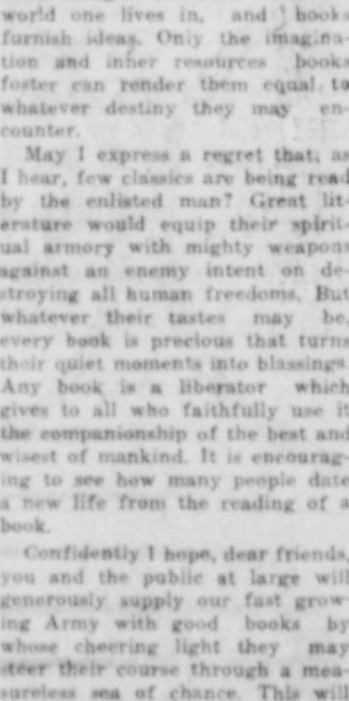

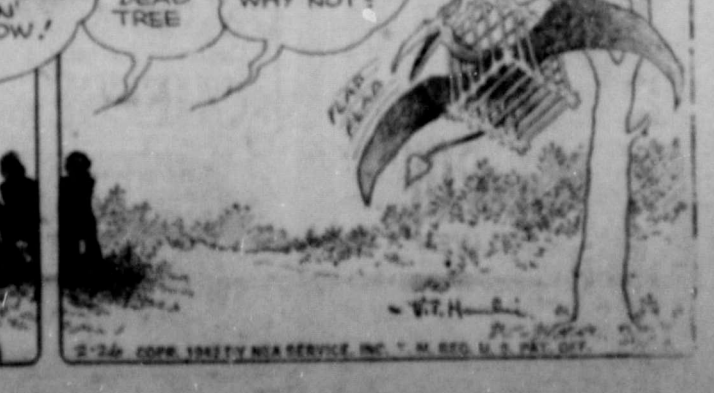

been placed on the rolls and 17,772 children in 7,540 families have applications pending. Applicants and recipients of aid reside predominantly in the larger cities.

When the death, continued illness, or absence of one or both parents leaves the family without any means of support or parental care, the Aid to Dependent Children program provides monthly cash payments to the mother or other close relative with whom the children may live for the maintenance of the home. The 47th Legislature appropriated money to finance the program, with the federal government matching funds dollar for dollar.

The law sets certain requirements for the receipt of assistance by dependent children. First: It must be proved that need exists. A family is considered to be in need if it lacks sufficient resources to maintain itself. A child must have lived in the state for at least a year beforehand, or, if it is an infant less than a year old, the mother must have lived in the state a year before it was born. Although the federal social security act provides for matching funds in giving aid to children up to 16 years of age, or 18 if the child is still attending school, the Texas constitution excludes benefits to children who have already attained the age of 14 or over.

Applications for aid to dependent children may be at the local office of the State Department of Public Welfare. The same workers who administer Aid to the Needy Blind and Old Age Assistance also administer the children's program. Applicants must supply certain information about the family and its circumstances so that the welfare office can determine whether the children may receive aid. The local office has available a Question and Answer pamphlet which gives full

Amarillo Mountain Of Song Fame Is Way Underground

By United Press
AMARILLO.—If a man can't stand up on his hind legs and see for 30 to 60 miles hereabouts, it's most likely because somebody came along and put up a telephone pole. Accordingly, there were not a few ribald guffaws when a song-maker wrote about Amarillo's mountains.

But the mountains are here, 2,000 feet and more beneath the present high prairie country. They were formed maybe 250,000,000 years ago and in the succeeding 150,000,000 years showed a lot of wear and tear, and finally had an awful sinking spell. The Texas Almanac geological summary tells about the ups and downs of the Amarillo mountains.

The range extended east and west across the Texas Panhandle, with peaks 7,000 feet above their bases. A great inland sea lapped against them and out in the suburbs of present Amarillo a man could have caught a lot of primitive fish. No seals or whales inhabited the ocean, however. The highest form of life then consisted of early amphibians, gigantic insects and cockroaches, which overran the country.

Twenty years ago men discovered the mountains when they began perforating the Panhandle for oil. Their bits and coring samples rounded out the picture for geologists. The Amarillo Mountains are in a good state of preservation, being packed away so securely. They are patriarchs, too. The Alps and Andes Himalayas and Rockies are youngsters of some 60,000,000 years by comparison.

"This program aims to give every dependent child in Texas the privilege of growing up in his own home," J. S. Murchison, Executive Director of the department said. "Home life is the highest and finest product of civilization. It is the great molding force of mind and of character. Children should not be deprived of it because of poverty. Cash assistance, and other services of this kind, enables young boys and girls to develop into useful and reliable citizens by making possible the maintenance of normal family life. Because of this program, children who are dependent and in need, like their more fortunate playmates, may now receive care until they are old enough to contribute to their own support."
