

some other phases. Huge bombers are built to give superspeed, to fly at extreme altitudes, regardless of the cost of construction or operation. Governments at war can't worry unduly about economy. But experts say these big planes will need a whale of a lot of revamping before anybody can use them to haul payloads in a self-supporting business venture. Moreover, there is a question how much freight and how many passengers are in sufficient hurry to pay the premiums to finance air transport.

As for family planes, did you ever stop to think how much more extensive terminal facilities, involving how much greater tax cost, are required for a plane than for an automobile? Do you know how your community could finance such costly improvements, at the same time maintaining streets and highways - for, of course, the plane owner must have a car to travel from home to airport.

None of these problems is insoluble. Some aren't even relatively difficult. The point is that such problems, and dezens more, exist and at best will require time for their solution.

Charge Accounts Not Paid By the 10th of the Second Month After Purchase Are Automatically Suspended By Government Regulation

Section 5 of Consumer Credit Regulation W, as revised effective May 6, 1942, stipulates that a charge account shall be in default if not paid in full by the 10th of the second month after purchase. All merchants are required to cease further extension of credit on such accounts. They may be reopened for use at any time, however, by payment of amount past due.
