INFORMATION ON WAR RATION **BOOK NO. 2 IS ISSUED BY** OFFICE OF WAR INFORMATION

Registration Will Start In Nation February 22. Any Member of Family May Make The Application for Book 2

Editors Note:-Registration for War Ration Book No. 2 n Ranger will take place February 25, 26, 27 at the Recreaton Building with the Ranger schools handling the registration. Further announcement as to plans for securing the books locally will be made as plans are completed.

DALLAS, Feb. 8 .- With registration for War Ration Book 2 scheduled to begin February 22, the Office of Price Administration offers to householders information which the registrars must have before the books can be issued. Here are some of the salient points:

(A) Any adult member of the family may make the application and receive the books for the entire family. They will not be given books for any member of the family who is in an institution or a member of the Armed Forces receiving subsistence in kind or eating at separate messes under an officers command.

(B) War Ration Book 1 of each member of the family must be presented at the registration.

(C) Each applicant must file a declaration on hand and one declaration form will serve for an entire family, but no one not a member of the family can apply on this form.





Fuses are the safety valves of your electric wiring, and when one "blows out," it is a sign that something is wrong, most often a worn appli-

You can save time and inconvenience by keeping a supply of fuses on hand (15 ampere for branch circuits and 30-


ampere for the main circuit). Then when a fuse "blows out," you can replace it with a new one quickly by following the six suggestions of Reddy Kilowatt, shown at the right. If some, but not all, of your lights go out, this indicates that a branch circuit fuse has blown. If all your lights go out, and lights next door are on, the trouble likely is a blown main circuit fuse.
