SAXONBURG, PA. - The cyclotron of Carnegie Institute of Technology — one of the world's most powerful — receives the first of 16 drums of "cyclotron oil". Developed and donated by Gulf Oil laboratories, the oil will cool the 90-ton circular magnet coils seen to the left. Circulated at the rate of 600 gallons a minute, it will prevent destruction of these coils during their generation of a magnetic field 40,000 times stronger than that of the earth. The cyclotron, still under construction, is expected to begin its "atom-smashing" work next year.
