Soviet Russia Now Quits Rola of Roughneck Nation

Stalin Encourages Desire \* For Broader Life for All

Central Press Columnist

WASHINGTON-"The Soviet Union joined the United States, Great Britain and China in the Moscow war and peace pact because Premier Josef Stalin is determined to lead his people out of the darkmess of suspicion into the sun of respectability."

This is the answer, according to a military man just back from Moseow, to the unexpected and conforting alliance of the four

"Stalin knows that the only way in which he can make a respeciable place for his people and make the world forget the 'Red' stigma is to co-operate with those nations that have the most respectability to offer," continued my military friend. "The Soviet Union's greatest moment of triumph, to date, was that moment ted States Secretary of State Cordell Hull and British Secretary of Foreign Affairs Anthony Esen traveled all the way to Moscow, with hat in hand, to urge Stalin,

Come on in with us. The water's fine. If you are to understand Stalin at all, so I was told, you must remember that he is vain. All leaders are vain. Or they wouldn't step out from the crowd. sarns to be regarded as a great man. What use are these won against the Germans with blood and sweat if the intinues to be disturbed by the nations it most admires?

you know that Josef Stalin is tired of being thought of as butcher boy?" the returned traveler asked me. "He is weary being looked down on as a vulgarian. He wants to join the easy brotherhood of Franklin Roosevelt and Winston Churchill. And Chiang Kai-shek, too-as a social equal if you like to put it that way. He wants to be a gentleman among gentlemen-a hero, not just another dictator in the history books."

asked my Soviet authority to tell me more about the Stalin mind. "Why," he continued, "the whole thing is as understandable as kindergarten work. Stalin has killed all the people in his own country that need to be killed in order to preserve the republic. His army has been winning gloriously. His co-operative farms, one of the great Soviet experiments, are very successful. Stalin knows, moreov what new worlds he wants to conquer when peace comes. So that als people will worship him as they now do Lenin, he plans to give them back traditions cut away by the revolution. A comfortable bie also, with luxuries. And conventional religion and education."

From now on, the citizens of the Soviet must be regarded as equals of the English and Americans in elegance. The peace which they have won must be rewarded with the charming trappings of life. "Stalin wants to dress up Russia," the man from Moscow told me "He's already begun to dress himself up. You notice that he received Hull and Eden in a glittering new marshal's uniform. His people vant to dress up, too. 






#### Suggestions For Control Of Peach Tree Borers Given

Farmers will have to use the old PDB method for controlling peach ree borers since ethylene dichloride has been restricted to war uses reports R. B. Thomas, Jr., Vocational Agriculture teacher, PDB is a very effective control, and this restriction doesn't impose a great inconvience on peach prodrecs, he said.

In applying PDB (paradichlorbenzene), the soil around the tree should be smoothed with a hoe and the material placed in this circle at the rate of one-half ounce for our and five year old trees and ne ounce for older trees Thomas

The material should be applied ear the trunk, but not close than two inches, and should be overed with a few shovels of dirt which is mounded about the base of the tree. The dirt is removed after two or three weeks, he add-

This treatment should be given inmediately in order for it to be ffective Thomas warned, as the PDB crystals will not vaporize unless the soil is warm. In summer weather, however, it vaporizes too rapidly and will injure young

Trees infested with the peach tree borer have masses of gum around the base of the trunk where borers do most of their work. The arvae, which do damage to the tree, are about one inch long, milky white, with a hard brown head. Trees severly infected may die. This pest probably destroys more ovehards than any insect other than San Jose Scale.


