EASTLAND, Tex. Feb. 4, 1944.—The following proceedings were had in the Court of Civil Appeals, Eleventh Supreme Judicial District:

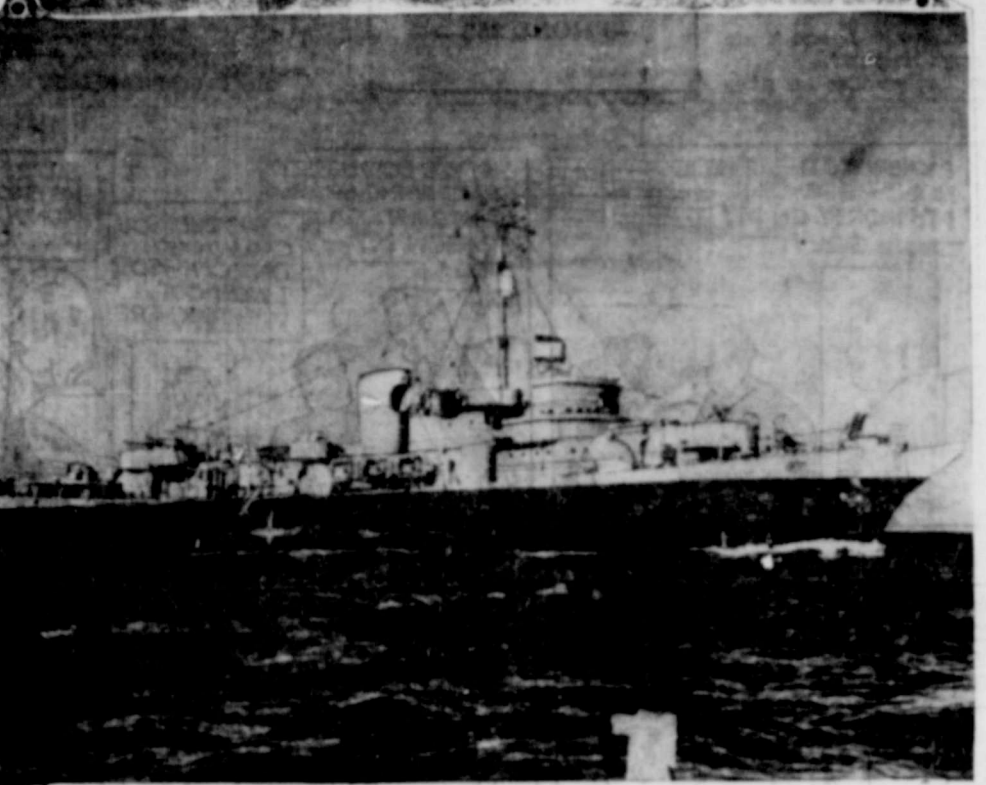

ANCIENT PALACE OF CZARS LOOTED BY THE NAZIS



THE ROYAL PALACE of Peterhof, Russia, once a treasure house of art objects, is seen in background, grim and dark, stripped bare by thieving Nazis who have, at last, been driven from the ancient summer resort town. The palace was begun by Czar Peter the Great in 1711 and was added to by Czar Nicholas II and Catherine II. In the empty hollow in the foreground was once a classic statue of Sampson, the Biblical hero and strong man. The statue was torn from its pedestal and set up by the Nazis for transportation to Germany with other art objects.

Gasoline—In states outside the East Coast area A-10 coupons are good through March 31.

Tire Inspection For A coupon holders, deadline is March 31. For B and C coupon holders, deadline is February 28.

Sugar—Stamp No. 30 in book four is good for five pounds through March 31. Stamp No. 40 in book four is good for five pounds of canning sugar through February 28, 1945.

Shoes—Stamp No. 18 in book one is good for one pair. Stamp No. 1 on the Airplane sheet in book three is good for one pair.

Meats Fats—Brown stamps V, and W good through February 26. Processed Foods—Green stamps C, D, E, and J in book four are good through February 20.

Green stamps K, L, and M are good through March 20. Income Tax deadline for filing returns, March 15, earlier filing is desirable.

RETURNING SUGAR

Housewives may now get five pounds of canning sugar by using stamp No. 40 in ration book four, OPA has announced, and additional canning sugar later will be available on application to local boards. Stamp No. 40 will be good 13 months, through February 28, 1945.

Demo's Big Dinner Fails To Rouse Old Enthusiasm Soldiers, Back in U. S., Sign for Solomon Islands

WASHINGTON—In case you'd like to hear a little from me about that Hundred-Dollar-A-Plate Jackson Day dinner the Democrats dished up at the Mayflower the other night, well—

In words of one syllable—it did not quite make the grade. I hope my old friend, Charlie Michelson, Democratic publicity chief and one of the smartest men in anybody's country, won't be too cross with me for writing this. But Charlie himself knows I am speaking the truth when I say there was something missing in that costly celebration. There was not any seasoning. The old-time Jacksonian flavor was missing. The show just did not come off.

The whole thing was a sort of rehash—you understand what I mean. You know how tasteless food always is when it has been standing around too long. It is flat and you sort of choke it down. You say, "That was undoubtedly a meal. There was meat and potatoes and spinach. I know I've been fed. But I didn't enjoy a mouthful. Too much reheating is hard on causes and food."

And if a gallery eye's view of the Jacksonian bandwagon on the best New Deal horse by Rooseveltian captivity, the boys and girls are not enjoying the Fourth or Reheated Term. There is no reason why they should enjoy the Fourth and Reheated Term. And no reason to apologize for having lost their taste for the same menu. Sixteen years is a long time for anybody to stay in the White House.

Of course, they are—the term is political—"going along." But how they hate it! You felt this attitude in the atmosphere of the banquet. Even Senator Hattie Caraway's Riband-in-the-Hair (the Lady from Arkansas looked very well) didn't make the speaker's table festive. Nor the orchid corsages most of the top-notch ladies wore.

So many people of importance were present that an extra speaker's table had to be run along the side of the room opposite the table from which Speaker Sam Rayburn, Vice President Henry A. Wallace and War Correspondent Quentin Reynolds told the audience and the microphones that the New Deal would have jobs for every fighting man when the war is over.

I almost wrote "Vice President" Rayburn instead of "Speaker" Rayburn. Some folk keep saying that "Mr. Sam" from Texas will be the running mate of Mr. Roosevelt in 1944. Other folks say Wallace will again be the presidential choice. The choice of Mr. Sam undoubtedly would please the southern conservatives. The real party men.

But, so I hear, Mr. Roosevelt may soon have to make an extra effort to please the left wingers. Some of the left wingers are pretty mad at the president. Maybe Wallace's renomination would calm their fears.

JUMPING QUICKLY TO ANOTHER FIELD of talk—have you seen the new Lira which Italy hopes to get its financial feet on the ground? It is a spectacular looking bank note and straight propaganda. I'm glad to report, successful propaganda. On the back of the note are the Four Freedoms—in full. A notation says the bill was issued by the United Nations.

I HEARD A REFRESHING STORY the other day about several soldiers who have been back in "The States" again. They sigh for those good, old-days in the Solomons when life was really something. Gosh, what food they had there. And what care. Something going on every minute, day and night. Contrast this nostalgia for the South Seas with the following quotation from—no, I can't tell you his name—but this is the quotation: "Here I sit, south of the equator, with the goomy birds on a God-forsaken, treeless, shrubless, grassless, womanless, nativeless coral atoll. Not Hollywood's version of the South Seas by my means. No Dorothy Lamour, black or white. Not even a black fuzzy Wuznie—just insects and solitary life here. Even the mosquitoes can't stand the place."

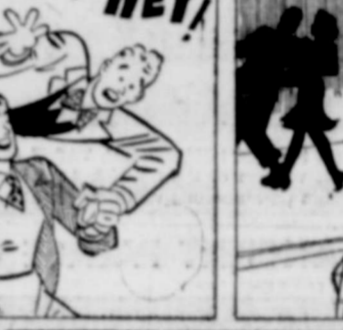
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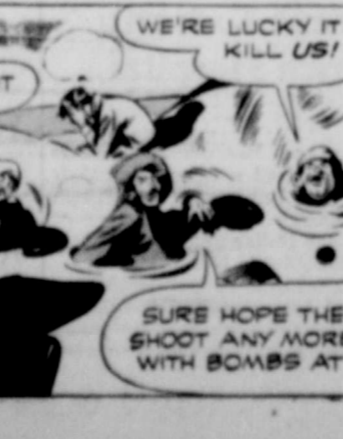

Demo's Big Dinner Falls To Rouse Old Enthusiasm Soldiers, Back in U. S., Sigh for Solomon Islands

WASHINGTON—In case you'd like to hear a little from me about that Hundred-Dollar-A-Plate Jackson Day dinner the Democrats dished up at the Mayflower the other night, well—

In words of one syllable—it did not quite make the grade. I hope my old friend, Charlie Mitchell, Democratic publicity chief and one of the smartest men in anybody's country, won't be too cross with me for writing this. But Charlie himself knows I am speaking the truth when I say there was something missing in that costly celebration.

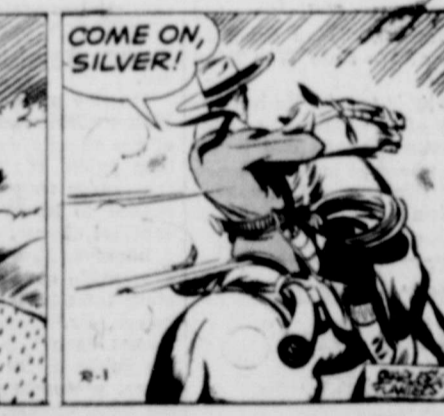
