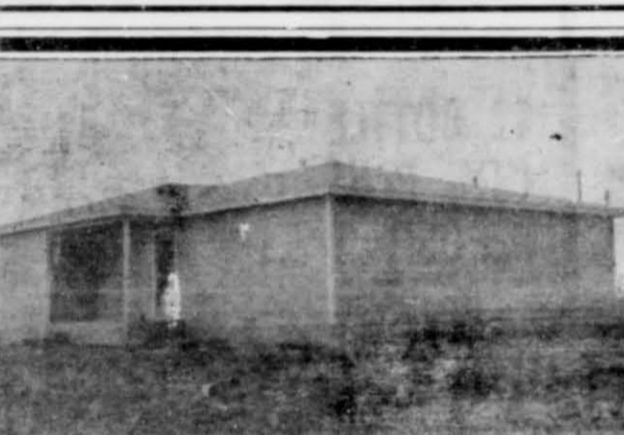


NEWS FROM FRIO
