END OF THE WAR

(From Dallas News)

Another huge offensive is under way—that of the international army of optimists. The prospects really are good, but we need to look back over the news dispatches of the last two years and reflect upon what happened to two former offensives of this kind.

The first drive of the wishful thinkers was precipitated by the grand Russian sweep of the Nazis back from Stalingrad, accompanied by the success of Allied arms in northern Africa and southern Italy. Commentators began to speak of Germany as "groggy, hanging on the ropes". Even some who were high in military command became outspokenly optimistic, and the wave of overconfidence projected itself into the Pacific zone. Admiral Halsey finished off both ends of the war in a pat prediction. On the home front, Mr. Ford went him one better. By September, 1943, he was even in Wall Street, and Main Street, that Germany would be down and out by Christmas.

It did not work out that way. But hope

springs eternal, especially with Americans. As 1944 approached the two thirds milestone being running even again that the war would be over by the end of the year. It was General Eisenhower's turn to speak out. He mentioned October. But October passed and then came the middle of December with von Rundstedt's sudden offensive. Our Christmas was spent in black gloom. Now, we were off again. This time General Montgomery is in command of the army of the hopeful.

Possibly the predictions of the high military and naval commanders were deliberately premature as part of a war of psychology against the enemy. If so they deserve a martyr's laurels, even though they win the war, for what man has not a quick and intense pride in his aptitude at prophecy. And it is a fact that all of the evidence is now on the side of an early finish of the struggle in Europe—and in the Pacific. We even join in the prediction. But let us keep our powder dry. And let us remember that, when the firing ceases on the battle fronts, we will face new and possibly greater problems. There will be no place for complacency in this world for many years. Not if we are going to win what we are fighting this war for.

WE HAVE PAID A BIG PRICE, BUT OTHERS HAVE PAID MORE

This country has paid a big price because of the war, but notwithstanding all the shortages and inconveniences imposed, we are still the most fortunate nation on earth now engaged in the war. We have not had a single city or a single home devastated by bombs. We have not had a single industry destroyed in a night raid. We have not had families by the thousands broken up, the members carried off by invaders and put to work in foreign munitions plants or worse. We have not been or called upon to crawl out of the ruins of a bombed home and discover that one or more members of the family have been buried lifeless in its ruins. True war has brought its hardships and its sacrifices, but ours has been a small sacrifice compared to that of millions of others.

I heard of a young war wife who said she "couldn't stand" for her husband to go overseas. When she received word that he had been taken her grief knew no bounds. Crying for three days and nights made her sick, and a doctor had to be called to administer a sedative. When this same young woman's baby began to

show signs of learning to walk, she did her best to prevent him. Why? Oh, haven't you guessed? Daddy must be home to see Sonnie take his first steps, and daddy (along with countless other daddies) is on another continent without much prospect of coming home soon.

Another war wife, and by the way, she deeply loves her husband has so mastered her fears and lon-

eliness that the world does not behold her grief. She keeps busy, she takes her troubles to God in prayer, and thereby escapes the hardships of carrying the burdens that God will carry for her.

Which one of these loves best and which one would keep her soldier husband's morale highest? They both have the same problem but they face it differently.



Waffles are a Special Treat at Our House!

How to Care for Your Waffle Iron

Clean the grids when baking is finished, and when the waffles are still a sizzle, dip them with a clean dry cloth. Remove any particles with a stiff brush. Never wash the grids. Lightly rub the film of grease that keeps waffles from sticking. If waffles stick, at some times happen when grids are too hot or not hot enough, be sure to clean thoroughly. It may be necessary to repeat the "break-in" process used when the iron was new.

The waffle iron and other familiar household electric appliances have stood the test of time. Although nearly three years have passed since the manufacture of appliances was stopped because of the war, these electric servants, some of them bought many years ago, still add zest to a meal, save time and energy, or otherwise make the work of homemakers easier.

While electric appliances were built to last, they need a little extra care these days to assure their usefulness until manufacturers can resume appliance production. Keep them clean and be careful they don't drop. When repairs are needed, take them to an electric shop that specializes in appliance repair work.

Army Recruiting WACs To Serve In Hospitals

SMOKY HILL ARMY AIR BASE, Salina, Kan. (UP)—Gen. of the Army George C. Marshall, chief of staff, U. S. Army, announced recently the beginning of a new and vigorous recruiting drive to enlist Wacs for the newly created Women's Army Corps Medical Units, for service at the Army's 60 general hospitals in this country.

The drive is aimed at relieving the critical shortage of Army nurses and technically trained personnel, Gen. Marshall said.

Marshall called upon the governors of the 48 states and the Commissioners of the District of Columbia to exercise their leadership in aiding the program.

Women qualified for training as medical and surgical technicians, clerical workers and other skilled women are urgently needed to fill these hospital units to aid in the care and rehabilitation of returned soldiers. More than 8,000 additional Wacs are required.
