#### Man Learns The Hard Way

This sixth anniversary of the start of World War II finds it ended, with a sickening record of death and destruction such as was never envisioned short of Armageddon, when "every island fled away and the mountains were not found."

Man can now make the islands flee into nothingness and the mountains disappear through the atomic bomb. With the revelation of this cosmic weapon, cynics immediately prophesied that with "the next war" mankind will destroy

Must there be a next war? It is a saddening fact, but nonethe less a truth, that man learns only "the hard way" -by bitter experience. Only after epidemics decimate the population does he promulgate and enforce public health aws; only after disastrous conflagration does he consider ire safety regulations; only after unruly rovers have devastated the land for generations does he devise flood control measures.

But he does take these preventive steps-and therein lies the secret of man's progress toward safer living which makes him today the physical better of his forbears in ev-

So, though the pessimistic cynics may see, in modern weapons of war, only a means through which mankind ultimately will destroy itself, others, with more patience, look upon man's overall record with faith. They see him toiling painfully up through the centuries, ever making a safer life and a larger horizon, despite such temporary setbacks as the Dark Ages and the periodically recurring wars, each taking increasingly larger toll in ever more horrible ways. These men of faith know that as recently as the start of World War I, man saw war as a glamorous adventure. But they know that in the bloody muck of Flanders Fields and the trenches of France he learned a lesson. With long-range weapons, men killed other men whom they could not see. Death struck anonymously. Poison gas gave

the coup de grace to the last illusion of martial glamor. Man did learn that lesson from World War I. But he did not learn it well enough and on some, the lesson was entirely lost. These spiritual laggards again sought glory in war, as did their brutish ancestors. And the good men-the men who had learned the lesson of World War I-met them in combat. They fought, not in glamorous mood, but as strong men who face an ugly task and do not shirk it.

So once again was demonstrated the lesson that no on wins a war-some merely lose more than others. And those who have long range faith in mankind may hope that this war —the hardest of "the hard ways"—may be the last lesson man will need on this subject. They hope that the future's history books will not call it World War IIbut refer to it as "The Last War.

As we look back upon it, one of the most foolish things that this country ever did was the scrapping of its battleships after the first World War. We recall vividly the publicity the event received. It was hailed as a grand gesture toward peace. As such it was a complete, utter and tragic failure. While we were scrapping our ships Japan and Germany were laying keels for new and bigger ships. We've given this pacifist dope a trial in this country and it has proven to be a failure. How about trying the other plan. Let's have a navy big enough so that it will command our respect here at home. If we do, it will be respected in the rest of the world also. The same thing goes for our army and a program of universal military training.

this item appears in the budget, they are culled "information men."

Their job, with variations, is to keep John Q. Public convinced that the big boss is the only man in the U. S. for his job and everything his agency does is strictly in the best interest of the people. Usually, because most of the dealings are with the press, an ex-newspaperman

Keeping the big boss out of trouble with the press frequently be comes a major task for these public relations men. Next to Secretary of Interior Harold Ickes, maybe, who is only happy when he's battling the press, former Attorney General Francis Biddle had the best knack for getting himself in bad in the public eye.

ROTUND, jolly Charles Malcolmson, former Washington correspondent for the Philadelphia Record, had the herculcan task of keeping Biddle out of the public frying pan.

It is well known in inner circles that Biddle was dead set against the government taking over Montgomery Ward. But the President and Jimmy Byrnes insisted, so it fell to Biddle to be the fall guy, with Charlie behind the scenes to ease the fall. With the situation as it was, it is recognized he did a good job. Such things as Biddle's being snapped in a picture at the last convention in Chicago with a ridiculous paper hat askew on his head doing some kind of a jig that gave the

appearance of his being tipsy gave Malcolmson many a sleepless night Frequently these information men turn up with something that saves the taxpayer dough and makes everybody happy. One of the best recent examples was performed by Bob Horton, head of public relations for the Maritime Commission,
