### Radio Activity Of Minerals And Rocks Objective

Austin, Texas — Radio activity in rocks and the physical properties of rocks and minerals heads the list of research projects to be carried on this year by Dr. Darrell S. Hughes, new geophysicist at the University of Texas.

For the past three years director of the geophysical research activity with the Shell Oil Company in Houston, Dr. Hughes began his lectures at the University last week in the physics department.

With the exception of one year when he was on a leave of absence to work with the Naval Ordnance Laboratory, Dr. Hughes has been with the Shell Oil Company since 1939 where he specialized in gravity and seismic data and was supervisor of research and development of geophysical instruments.

Termed "one of the outstanding geophysicists in the nation today" by Dr. M. Y. Colby, head of the physics department at the University, Dr. Hughes is a member of The American Physical Society, The American Geophysical Union, The Society of Exploration Geophysicists, and The American Association of Petroleum Geologists. He received his doctorate degree at the University of Chicago in '31, and his bachelor of arts and master of science degrees at the University of Kentucky.

### Sales Courses Being Arranged For Ft. Worth

FORT WORTH — "Distributive education," designed to aid employers and employees of retail and wholesale firms in improving merchandising methods and human relations, is being established in Fort Worth.

A series of courses supplied by the University of Texas extension division is being instituted, first for employers and later for the man who deals personally with the customer.

Wade L. Banowsky, formerly of the university's extension staff, has been employed by the Fort Worth Public School System as director of the project. The Retail and Wholesale Development Committee of the Chamber of Commerce is the business sponsor.

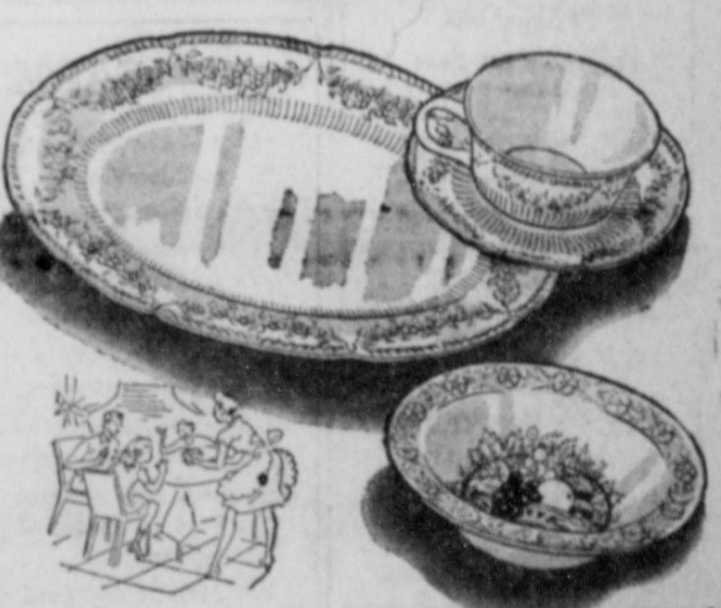

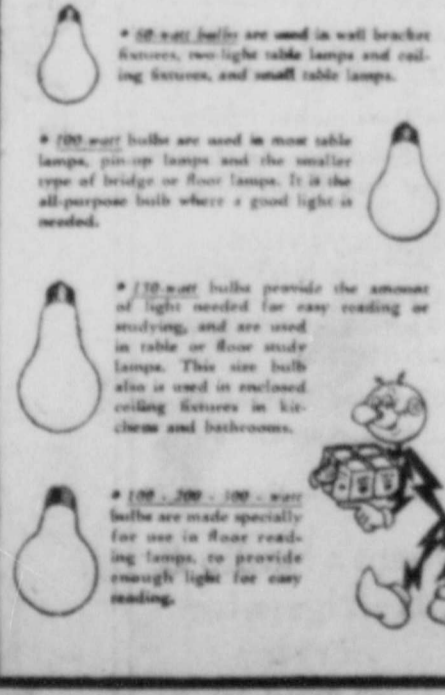
