

There is now pending in Congress a bill known as the Bulwinkle Bill (HR 2536) which would settle the wrangle between the Anti-Trust Department and the Interstate Commerce Commission, as to who is going to regulate the Railroads. The question is, who is going to do the regulating? We believe that the Interstate Commerce Commission, a body with the experience and know how, should be the one to regulate the carriers, and the Bulwinkle Bill if passed by Congress will definitely resolve the question in favor of the Interstate Commerce Commission, therefore, we think the bill should be passed by Congress, and as quickly as possible. This matter is of vital importance to the Railroads, Truck Lines, Waterways and the shipping public in gen-

Dr. J. C. Stearn, dean of the faculty of Washington University, St. Louis, Mo., and director of scientific personnel procurement on the atomic research program, popped the mesotron idea at a group of congressmen during a protest session on the atomic energy control bill. Study of cosmic

rays, which constantly bombard the earth from the transmutation of atoms in interstellar space, have revealed the presence of the mesotron. Meso means in the middle and tron is chargethat is, electrical charge as in proton, neutron and electron. Hence the name mesotron, or electrical harge from the middle space between the stars. Whereas the fission of the uranium atom releases millions of electron volts, the mesotron will re-

lease billions. It's just one of the many fascinating

bits of research the scientists have ahead of them. Getting back to earth, the watchmaking industry is getting fed up with the flamboyance of its own advertising. What they don't like is use of the words "waterproof," "shockproof" and "nonmagnetic." Under the auspices of the Federal Trade Commission, watch industry representatives will meet in Washington early in December to work out a new fair trade agreement






