

It was before Mr. Justice Goldsborough that at torneys for the Department of Justice appeared, seeking a restraining order to prevent the United Mine Workers from breaking their contract to work under government seizure of the mines. Justice Goldsborough granted the order.

It is Justice Goldsborough who must decide in the first instance whether John L. Lewis and L. United Mine Workers violated this restraining odder. It is Justice Goldsborough who must decide whether the restraining order is to be continu 1 after Nov. 27.

There are a number of cases in which the reputations of federal judges have been made by important labor decisions.

In the eight years that Justice Goldsborough has been on the benchmin Washington, he has been pretty unpredictable. He served in Congress for 19 years before Roosevelt appointed him to the bench. In the 27 years he has been around Washington he has found out what goes on in politics and all the facts of life.

THE record of cases he has heard shows he has a fondness for trials in which there is a lot of public interest. He doesn't mind hulla-\_baloo and headlines over his decisions.

Lawyers who have argued cases before him differ in their appraisal of him, but they seem to agree that if he thought John L. Lewis guilty, he would just as soon put him in jail as look at him. He is utterly afearless and a match for John L. in color and personality any day. He makes quick decisions and sticks to them like grim death. He has had numerous rows with the District Court of Appeals, and he probably holds the record for the number of his decisions reversed

by these higher courts.

In the trial of Gaston Means, who persuaded Evalyn Walsh McLean to finance his private detective work on the Lindbergh kidnaping case, Justice Goldsborough told a witness, "I think you're a damned liar," right before the jury The Court of Appeals gave him a terrible bawling-out for that, but his decision was upheld.

# **VETS REMINDED** OF IMPORTANT **GI DEADLINES**

Mr. A. D. Modisett. Contact Representative from Eastland VA Contact Office who comes to Ranger each Saturday morning from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon in the Postoffice, today reminded World War II veterans of important deadlines for benefits to which hey are entitled.

The first affects an estimated 'The first affects an estimated 100,000 alien-veterans who served n the U. S. Armed Forces after September 1, 1939 and who still re eligible to become American citizens easily before December 31, 1946, when the Second War Power Act expires, They should apply at the nearest office of The Immigration and Naturalization Service for further details.

The second deadline affects approximately 10,000,000 veterans who have let their GI Term Insurance lapse. They may reinstate this insurance on or before Febuary 1, 1947, without a physical examination by signing a statement that their health is as good now as when their policies lapsed now as when their policies lapsed

Deadlines for several other benefits will be set automatically when the President or Congress officially declares World War II ended.

They are:

Loans-home, farm and business loans may be guaranteed or insured by VA up to 10 years after the end of the war.

Education education or j o bcompleted within 9 years.


