A fixed-price sale of new clothing was announced Friday by War Assets Administration, Ft. Worth. The clothing consists of olive drab field trousers, winter flying

goggles and summer flying helmets. It is being offered to all priority claimants, including veterans of World War II, and to commercial channels concurrently. Orders will be filled in sequence of priority, headed by federal agencies buying for their own use and by veterans buying for use in their own small business, professional or agricultural enterprise.

The sale opens Saturday and closes January 28. Further information may be secured by W.A.A. T&P Bldg., Ft. Worth.

Shepherds And Caretakers To Be Honored at Show

FORT WORTH, Tex. — The unsung heroes of the livestock show are going to be recognized at the Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show in Fort Worth March 5-16. They are the herdsmen, shepherds and caretakers of prize-winning livestock.

Ever since stock shows were originated, the judges have pinned all the ribbons on the livestock, ignoring the men who feed, water, brush and beautify the animals for the grand march into the judging arena.

This year at the Fort Worth show the livestock judges will continue to pass out the ribbons for the animals, but another committee, named by the management will award prizes or "bouquets" to the herdsmen, shepherds and caretakers.

These livestock attendants will be in competition under a plan inaugurated by Edgar Deen, general manager of the show. They will be judged on orderliness and cleanliness in keeping stalls and animals, promptness, system employed around the stalls and animals, personal appearance, observation of rules and cooperation with the management.

One prize valued at \$15 in merchandise will be awarded to a herdsman, shepherd or caretaker in each division of the show. Also, the management will award a grand prize of \$30 in cash to the best all-around herdsman, shepherd

LITERACY FOUND SPOTTY IN CHICAGO

CHICAGO (UP) — More than four per cent of Chicago's adults 25 years or older have had no formal schooling, and 11.6 per cent have attended school for fewer than five years, according to a survey made by the Chicago Census Advisory Committee.

The survey also showed that 48 per cent of the adults have had from five to eight years of schooling; 72.8 per cent attended high school, and 11.6 per cent had some college work.

The median grade completed in school for the adult city as a whole was .85 or a half-year beyond the eighth grade.

NEW REHABILITATION PROGRAM IS ANNOUNCED

Seven thousand severely disabled North Texas veterans will be aided by a special rehabilitation program initiated Jan. 20 by the Veterans Administration in its Dallas Regional Office.

A rehabilitation board, composed initially of five members, will attempt to match the physical conditions, skills and interests of handicapped veterans with job training opportunities. The program calls for advisement and training of blind and deafened veterans, men and who have lost their limbs or who have suffered paralysis, and veterans with disabilities from heart conditions, tuberculosis or nervous disorders.

The board's appointment was announced by Robert C. Rice, regional manager. Rice said vocational advisors, training officers, physicians and other specialists in the handicapped field would attempt first to stimulate the veteran to consider his future. Then steps will be taken to help him solve his particular problem.

Any severely handicapped veteran in the 51 counties in the Dallas Region who applies for advisement and training will be brought to the Dallas Regional Office at government expense. Consultants, said the manager, will work with the veteran, determine his capabilities and present the types of training most suited. Applications from veterans in Ranger will be taken by Mr. A. D. Modisett, Contact Rep. when he comes to Ranger each Saturday from 9:00 until 12:00 on Itinerant Service.

"When we have found a field in which we believe the veteran can be rehabilitated," Rice explained, "training officers dealing with the placement problem will stress this man's abilities rather than his disabilities. If our board has matched the veteran's ability and attitude with the job

requirements, the veteran will not be handicapped. His chances for success are very good."

In cases where the medical consultant finds training should not immediately be attempted, the board will recommend such physical, mental or social therapy as it feels the particular veteran needs. When a man has been selected for training, VA will be especially careful not to place him in an environment which would aggravate his disability or tax his physical or mental condition.

Stolen Italian Art Recovered Abroad

NAPLES (UP)—The Italian commission for recovery of fine art stolen during the Nazi occupation reported that great quantities of missing art have been found in Austria and Germany.

Some of the paintings, the commission said, were greatly damaged. They include Raphael's "Madonna of the Divine Love," Titian's "Diana," Filippo Lippi's "Annunciation," Palma's "Sacred Conversation," gravely damaged; Colantonio's "St. Girolamo," also badly damaged, and a d'Adda's "Madonna with Child."

Also recovered by the commission were bronzes, including the statue of Apollo discovered in the ruins of Pompeii and two statues of fawns, also found near Pompeii. The latter suffered broken legs and ears in the thefts from Italy during the war.

Sulfa Not Sub For Surgery, He Says

CLEVELAND (UP)—War experience "completely unseated the dangerous teachings that wounds could be salted down with sulfa drugs as an alternate to prompt surgical treatment," according to Dr. Edward D. Churchill, professor of surgery at Harvard University.

Dr. Churchill made his statement at a meeting here of the American College of Surgeons.

The doctor, however, said penicillin and at times sulphadiazene were administered systematically to control feared or established infection.

SURVIVORS OF DISCHARGED VETS MAY CLAIM LEAVE PAY

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Widows, children or parents of former soldiers who died after honorable discharge from the Army, who had not claimed their pay prior to death are entitled to collect these payments, the War Department has announced. An estimated 40 million dollars is due eligible survivors of Army personnel in this category.

Due to the small number of claims of this type received by the Army so far, Major General William H. Kasten, Chief of Finance, U. S. Army, urged survivors of deceased former soldiers of World War II who had unused furlough time payable under the Armed Forces Leave Act of 1946 at the time of their separation from the Army, to write immediately to the Finance Officer, U. S. Army, Army Finance Center, Building 204, St. Louis 20, Missouri, for an application.

Up to this time the Finance Officer, U. S. Army, at St. Louis, has received 4800 claims from survivors for terminal leave pay due former soldiers who have died since leaving the Army. General Kasten pointed out that the St. Louis office is the only Army finance office handling survivors' claims for unused leave and all inquiries must be addressed to that office only.

Survivors who may be eligible are defined as a wife who was lawfully wedded to the deceased former serviceman on the date of his death, or child or children in equal shares. In the event there is no wife or children, settlement will be made to the parents of the deceased former soldier. The term "parent" includes father and mother, grandfather and grandmother, stepfather and stepmother, father and mother through adoption, and persons who, for a period of not less than one year prior to the death of the former soldier, stood in place of parents to such former enlisted man. This applies equally to deceased women of the Women's Army Corps.

Payment of claims filed by such survivors will be made by U. S. Treasury check and not in savings bonds as in the case of settlements made to living veterans who make their own claim under the Armed Forces Leave Act.

General Kasten emphasized that the former soldier on whose behalf eligible survivors make claims, must have been honorably discharged from the service. No benefits under this law are due the survivors of those soldiers who died while in active service or who were killed in action, he said, since the usual death benefits in these cases have already been paid to eligible survivors and no further benefits are due them under the terms of the Armed Forces Leave Act of 1946. Payments made by the St.

Louis Finance Officer to date have ranged from \$20 to \$975 for a single claim, depending on the amount of unused furlough time which was due the deceased soldier at the time of his discharge and the rank held when discharged. Application blanks and complete instructions necessary for making survivor's claims for unused furlough leave time may be obtained by written request from the Finance Officer, U. S. Army, Army Finance Center, Building 204, St. Louis, 20, Missouri.

At the same time General Kasten pointed out that up to this time many living veterans have not filed their claims for their unused leave time. He urged those who have not already done so, to file their claims immediately, since Army Paying officers are geared for prompt payment at this time.
