

## **SOVIET CLAIMS** PLAN WOULD **DELAY ACTION** THREE MONTHS

By United Press LAKE SUCCESS- The United States offered a compromise today to break a Soviet-American deadlock over disarmament procedure, but Russia immediat-

ely balked. Andrei Gromyko of Russia rejected the compromise, charging it would delay any possible action on disarmament at least three months. Gromyko insisted that the United Nations Security Council draw up its own concrete proposals for prompt general dis-

The United States had promised that America will move along the road toward disarmament "as fast and as far as our fellow members of the UN will travel

with us." American Delegate Warren Austin submitted to the council ment discussions, but at the same time guarantee priority for atomic control. He said the resolution President Truman, Secretary of State George C. Marshall and

Austin emphasized that the atomic bornb must be controlled 2before the world begins to junk its other weapons, and that the United States will not lay down

Austin said the United States-will not repeat the "bitter" ex-perience of disarming alone, as did after the first world war. "There is only one road to dis-armament," he said, "that is the road of genuine collective security and genuine international control of all armaments and armed forces."


