Blind Girl Clicks As Radio Ham

ROCHESTER, N. Y. (UP)—Rochester claims a rarity—a blind woman amateur radio operator. She is 23 year old Lucille Sweet, who maintains that her experience suggests rehabilitation aid to blinded veterans. Almost immediately after a 100-watt transmitter was set up in her home she contacted amateur stations in Texas, Nebraska, Arkansas and a boat in the Gulf of Mexico. She learned the art of radio operation and the mysteries of the circuit theory by means of wires strung over cardboard. She holds a Class B operator's license.

Radio is not her only interest. Besides holding a job as machine operator at Kodak Park, where she is the company's only blind employee, she is currently taking lessons in tap dancing.

"A blind person should tackle anything he has the desire to do," she says, "whether or not it sounds possible. Once you really try, it's surprising what you can accomplish."

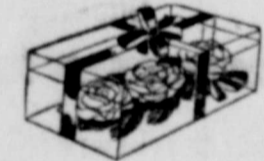

VETERANS Train To Be CABINET MAKERS

The Veterans Administration has signed a contract, authorizing us to train you to be first class woodworkers.

In addition to paying your tuition, the Veterans Administration will pay you a subsistence allowance of \$65.00 per month if you have no dependants or \$90.00 per month if you have dependants.

Cabinet Making training is now in progress at the Wood-Production Shop, under the management of the WEST TEXAS VOCATIONAL INSTITUTE. You may enter training at any time.
