

a summer camp on a Texas lake. The session has the usual supply of hunting and fishing bills but some of these liberalize rather than restrict the sportsmen's

new laws to observe if all the proposals that have been made get onto the statute book. F o r instance they will be restricted and they may find a force of state sky-cops circling around to break up "buzzing" girl friends and other low flying.

The session is no exception in the matter of proposed dog laws. This time the value of a dog i recogized by a proposal to make it a felony to steal a dog. Another bill would permit a dog owner to register tattoo marks on the dogs as a means of identification.

Family relations have worried egislators who view with alarm the rising divorce rate and its effect on children of divorcees.

Given a flooring-blow in the Senate but hanging on the ropes with a pending motion for recon sideration, is a bill that would make the divorce judge consider support of a child not yet born. Divorce petitions would be required to reveal possibility of a birth after the divorce. Another bill would require disclosure of living children of the couple seeking separation. 




